

February Lecture and Workshop

In February we are lucky to have a nationwide quilt and fiber expert, Lori Lee Triplett. Ms Triplett has a nationwide reputation as a quilt and fiber expert who has written more than 15 books and many magazine articles and has received research grants and scholarship awards in the areas of pioneer, historical, and indigo dying from Africa to America. As a lecturer and instructor she brings her experience from stage, screen, and radio to make the presentations fun yet educational. She enjoys presenting at national conferences and internationally and also at local quilt guilds. An art quilter, Lori prefers to work with hand dyed or hand painted fabric to create. Her artwork has been featured in multiple exhibitions, websites, publications, and books. Her art can be found in private and corporate collections, as well as museums.

Ms. Triplett's lecture in February will be "Celebrating the Blues." We will learn about the history of indigo and the influence that African culture had on America. She will bring many quilts and samples.

Her workshop will be an indigo resist workshop in which we will learn 4 different resist techniques of resist dying to create beautiful and interesting fabrics. For each student she will provide one yard of fabric and all dyes and other materials needed to make our own indigo resist quilt.

The fee for the class is \$35 plus a required \$15 materials fee.
