quilting projects. As we gear up for our Springtime Gala, I am eagerly anticipating the stunning display of quilts that you all will share with us.



April Workshop and Speaker Ocean Art and Creativity



In March, our workshop participants learned PRECISION paper piecing. In April, we have the opportunity to have fun with an art quilt that includes learning how to sew curved piecing. But—NO points and NO matching corners to worry about! This quilt offers multiple embellishment options and I will bring lace and fancy ribbons for you to use as you wish. This can be a wall hanging, a quilt by adding borders or additional blocks, or an element in an "orphans and aliens" quilt that Rita Jones will teach in 2025. This will be such a fun, no-stress class! The supply list includes cutting 6-inch 22-inch strips before the class,

nothing complicated!

Gwen Weedon has been quilting for over 30 years in San Luis Obispo. She started to teach quilting 20



years ago. She has taught in San Luis Obispo at adult education classes and has taught machine quilting at local quilt shops and for local Guild classes. She had her own longarm business for almost 20 years.

She is a professional graphic artist and has won several ribbons for her quilts. She will have a trunk show at our meeting to display her art quilts demonstrating her 25-year journey in quilting.

The theme of the Springtime Gala is "In the Bag" which will be held Saturday May 11th, 2024. This year we will have our challenge the member quilt display as the décor at the Gala luncheon. <u>You can</u> participate in both the display and the challenge! Every entry submitted will receive a "thank you for participating" gift made by us, for you! You won't need to attend the Gala to submit an entry, we'd like to have ALL the members' talents represented at the Gala! **All entries must be received by the April 22nd general meeting.**

We will not have a featured speaker so please submit a quilt for the member display. Currently only two members have committed to showing their quilts for the member display, without quilts to display it would be a very sad showing. Please complete the form for the display ASAP so we can create a plan on the display space.

We plan on using the stage for our member display, but a sleeve is not required on your quilt. There is limited display space around the room so if your quilt is large, it may be folded so it can be hung. We apologize in advance for this situation but hope you will submit your quilt for this display.

We are excited to see what creations are submitted for this year's Fiber Arts Challenge! The completed challenge item does not need to be a quilt, it can be clothing, handbag, table runner or wall-hanging, or any item of your choice. Members must buy a kit to participate in the challenge but can add any fabric or embellishment to their challenge item.

The Fiber Arts challenge voting will occur during the Springtime Gala. A Viewer's Choice Awards will be presented for each category. The awards will be presented on the day of the event or given to the person at the next general meeting if they aren't in attendance. There are 18 members participating in the challenge. Please include the completed form when you turn in your item.

Each Challenge item or Member display quilt would need to be labeled so we can return it safely. If possible, submit the item in a labeled pillowcase to ensure your item will remain in pristine condition. The committee is excited to see what creative items our members submit!

North Cities Quilt Guild Member Charmella Secrest started Quilt Reaction Force (QRF) in 2018 and has produced and awarded 225 quilts to date (sent to 28 states and 2 territories), Charmella has also long arm quilted over 1,000 quilts for other military charities as well as

QRF. She works with the Sons of the American Revolution, Orange County Chapter.

In April 2023 Charmella presented a quilt to Norio Uyematsu, a Korean War veteran. In early 2024 Charmella was notified by the Smithsonian Institution that the quilt would be featured in a Korea War display in the National Museum of American History.

The quilt was pieced by Lori Ross, Un Hui did the binding and Charmella did long arm quilting.

Fee to Participate: \$75.00 – This includes your pattern, morning coffee, lunch, door prizes, and instructor.



May Block of the Month

Castle in the Air





Color 1 one 2-1/2" x 10" strip AND one 4-7/8" square AND one 5-1/4" square



Color 2 one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip AND one 4-7/8" square


Color 3 two 4-7/8" squares AND one 5-1/4" square AND one 4-1/2" square




First mark and cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 10" strip into four 2-1/2" squares



Mark and cut the Color 2 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip into two 4-7/8" squares. Stack and cut these together on the diagonal to make four half square triangles




Speed piece the half squares, by stacking a Color 3 and Color 1 4-7/8" square right sides together, and a Color 3 and Color 2 4-7/8" square right sides together. On the back of the top squares, lightly mark the diagonals. Sew a scant 1/4" above the marked diagonals, and again a scant 1/4" below the marked diagonals. Cut apart ON the marked diagonals to get two half squares of each. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabrics. Trim these back to measure 4-1/2" if needed...




To make the half quarter squares, stack a Color 3 and a Color 1 5-1/4" square right sides together, and as in the step above, mark the diagonals and sew a scant 1/4" above and below this marking. Cut apart on the marked diagonal, then stack the two closed units, and cut again on the other diagonal. This will give you four half

quarter squares. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabrics...




Sew each of the four half quarter squares to a Color 2 half square triangle. Press seam allowances towards the half square triangles. Trim these back to measure 4-1/2" if needed



Place a 2-1/2" Color 1 square right sides together lined up with the upper left corner of a Color 3 4-1/2" square. On the back of the small square, mark the diagonal, and sew ON this marked line. Cut off excess seam allowance and press the

remainder towards the small square. Repeat this with another Color 1 square on the opposing corner and then on each of the two remaining corners. Trim this back to measure 4-1/2"



Now piece the block, by joining the units in the order shown at left. Make rows and then join the rows together. Alternate pressing directions by addition and by row..

NCQG Bits & Pieces 2023-2024

A great way to use up those scraps, especially your 2 1/2" strips. Participate just one month or every month. Months we are dark you can also make blocks and turn them in the month before or after.

Make 7 blocks. One to keep and 6 to exchange.

Color pallet: WHITE or WHITE ON WHITE background & medium to dark print for the spools





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Cut the print fabric 2-1/2" x 10" strip into four 2-1/2" squares...



Then cut the white fabric 5" x 6-1/2" rectangle into two 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles...



Too make the side units, place a Color 1 square right sides together atop the left and right ends of a Color 2 rectangle, with outer edges aligned.(I show them staggered here just so you can see what fabric pieces I mean) On the back of the squares lightly mark the diagonal. Sew ON this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the triangle. Make two of these. They should measure 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" when completed...



Now lay out all units as shown at left. Stitch together using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seams to center, and you are all done! Nice and Easy! :0) Square should be 6 ¹/₂"
