Block Of The Month August 2022

This years BOM 2021- 2022 will be Quilting and Sewing notion theme. You will get to use different sewing techniques during this next year.

Make 2- one for yourself and one to turn in. You will receive a different block in return.

The block is 12 1/2 " when completed.

Cutting Instructions:

Background (Aqua- you could change this depending on the color of your bow)

- 1 2 2 1/2 x 5" rectangle
- 2 1- 2 1/2 x 8 1/2" rectangle
- 3 4- 1 1/2 x 1 1/2" square
- 4 2- 2 x 2" square
- 5 2- 2 x 8" rectangle
- 6 20- 1 x 1" squares
- 7 1- 1 1/2 x 2" rectangle

Bow (White)

- 8 1 1 1/2 x 1 1/2" square
- 9 2- 3 x 4" rectangle
- 10 1 1 1/2 x 8" rectangle

Fabric bundles (pick 5 fabrics and cut 5 sets)


11- Cut one set per fabric color you choose. 2- 2 x 4" rectangles

Assembly:

 Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 3 pieces. With right sides facing, place a 3 piece on the top left corner of a 9 piece. Stitch on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line and press. Repeat on




the bottom left corner of the 9 piece. In the same manner, mark the 4 pieces. With right sides facing, place a 4 piece on the top right corner of the 9 piece. Stitch on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line and press. Repeat these steps on the opposite corners of the remaining 9 piece to form the reversed 9 piece.



2. Join the 7 piece to the top of the 8 piece to form the 8 unit. Join the 9 piece to the left side of the 8 unit and join the reversed 9 piece to the right side of the 8 unit to form the bow unit which should measure 3" x 8 1/2"




3. Join the 2 piece to the top of the bow unit. Join a 1 piece to the left and right sides of the bow unit so that the bow unit now measures 5" x 12 1/2"



4. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 6 pieces. With right sides facing, place a 6 piece on the top left corner of an 11 piece. Stitch on the marked line. Trim 1/4" away from the stitched line and press. Repeat on the bottom left corner of the 11 piece. Repeat on the opposite corners of the remaining 11 piece to form the reversed 11 piece.

Make 5 sets of #4 step using the color fabric you choose for the fabric bundle.5.




5. Join each of the bundle pieces you made in step #4 together as in the picture below. to form the left bundle unit which should measure 4 1/2" x 8"



6 Join each of the bundle pieces you made in step #4 together as in the picture below. Which should measure 4 1/2" x 8"



7. Join the right bundle unit to the right side of the 10 piece and join the left bundle unit to the left side of the 10 piece to form the fabric unit. Join a 5 piece to the left and right sides of the fabric unit. Join the bow unit to the top of the fabric unit to form the finished block which should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"

Quilts of Valor for Veterans by Robin Poppy Chimino

Stitch by stitch. Thread by thread. Colorful pieces of fabric are woven together by loving hands to create a comforting quilt for our most valiant warriors

Quilts of Valor was born of a dream. A mother with a son in Iraq had the idea of him being comforted by a handmade quilt. Since 2003, over a quarter of a million quilts have been awarded to veterans across the country, all stitched by volunteers, all created to honor those who have fought for our freedom.

On July 25, several deserving veterans were each awarded a Quilt of Valor by the North Cities Quilt Guild at the Placentia Presbyterian Church.
