February Speaker and Workshop: Cathedral



Shelley last presented at our guild in 2015. Let's welcome her back! Swanland has been a quilt designer and teacher for 30 years. She is the author of *Machine Stitched Cathedral Windows* and *Machine Stitched Cathedral Stars* and her own line of patterns. She has contributed multiple consignment projects for fabric manufacturers and contributed to several quilt magazines, and has lectured and taught at over 150 guilds. She teaches a Cathedral Window technique that she developed, as well as Embellishment and Plant Prints on paper and fabric. At our meeting, she will present a trunk show of the many varieties of cathedral window quilts she has created.

Cathedral Windows is one of those bucket list quilts. For twenty years, Shelley has been creating Cathedral Window Quilts using her own technique that is

entirely by machine. No hand sewing needed! The technique uses three-dimensional piecing to construct the top and, during quilting, the bias folds are rolled and stitched in place to create a finished quilt. We will make a small wall hanging that can be featured on its own OR use the finished product in an "Orphans and Aliens" quilt. You have the option of buying a kit of precut fabrics for \$15 plus the pattern for \$5. You may also use your own fabric and buy the pattern. NCQG Bits & Pieces 2023-2024

A great way to use up those scraps, especially your 2 1/2" strips. Participate just one month or every month. Months we are dark you can also make blocks and turn them in the month before or after.

Make 7 blocks. One to keep and 6 to exchange.

Color pallet: WHITE or WHITE ON WHITE background & medium to dark print for the spools

Calico Spools

This makes a 6" finished block.

6" + 1/4 in seam allowances on all sides= 6 1/2 inch square

medium or dark print One 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle AND one 2-1/2" x 10" strip

WHITE or WHITE ON WHITE

One 5" x 6-1/2" rectangle


** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Cut the print fabric 2-1/2" x 10" strip into four 2-1/2" squares...



Then cut the white fabric 5" x 6-1/2" rectangle into two 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles...



Too make the side units, place a Color 1 square right sides together atop the left and right ends of a Color 2 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. (I show them staggered here just so you can see what fabric pieces I mean) On the back of the squares lightly mark the diagonal. Sew ON this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the triangle. Make two of these. They should measure 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" when completed...



Now lay out all units as shown at left. Stitch together using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seams to center, and you are all done! Nice and Easy! :o) Square should be 6 1/2"

This year we will have our challenge tied in with the May Springtime Gala. The theme of the Gala is "In the Bag" which is on Saturday May 11th, 2024. We'd like to have ALL the members' talents represented at the Gala. Participate in the challenge. Submit a quilt for the Members display. <u>You can participate in both the challenge and the members display.</u>

We hope you find this year's Fiber Arts Challenge inspirational! The focus fabric for our kit is the Kona color of 2024 "JULEP" along with red and orange solids. The committee is excited to see what creative items our members submit.

The completed challenge item does not need to be a quilt, it can be clothing, handbag, wall-hanging, or any item of your choice. You do not need to attend the Gala to participate in this challenge. All members are welcome to participate.

- Members must buy a kit to participate in the challenge at the cost of \$6, (cash or check, or credit card)
- Kits will be available at meetings until all kits are sold.
- You must use each of the fabrics provided. A little or a lot, front or back, inside etc. You can add any other fabrics but, we just must be able to recognize the fabrics provided in the kit.
- The creation can be any shape, it doesn't need to be square or a quilt, but the perimeter of the item should be no less than 40" (e.g.: 10" x 10") and not greater than 160" (40"x 40").
- Original designs and use of patterns are WELCOME but please give the designer credit if using a pattern.
- Challenges will be DUE AT THE APRIL 22, 2024, GUILD MEETING.
- Submit a form with the completed item. (Forms will be available at the January general meeting)
- Fiber arts challenge voting will occur during the Springtime Gala.
 Viewer's Choice Awards will be presented on the day of the event or given to the person at the next general meeting.
- Every entry will receive a "thank you for participating" gift made by us, for you!






Sewing Instructions

Note: Use ¼" seam allowance for all seams.


 To make a "geese" unit, place an "A" triangle right sides together with a "B" triangle. Sew along the diagonals. Repeat with the second "A" triangle on the other side of the "B" triangle. Press to the "A" triangles. Make 8 total.











Sew rows together.

North City Quilt Guild Friendship Groups Committee Chair: Peggy Ochoa

What is a friendship group, and why would you want to join one or form one of your own with a few friends?

Friendship groups share a love of quilts as all guild members do, but they meet outside of our regular guild meetings. A friendship group can have as few as three members to as many as your meeting place can hold, but the upper limit seems to be around 10. The Newbies are an exception since we meet at Orange Quilt Bee on the third Friday of each month from 11-2. A lower number allows you to meet in someone's home and makes going out to lunch and sitting at the same table a possibility. A smaller number also allows everyone in the group to get to know one another more easily than in the large guild meeting. Most friendship groups are formed around a time of day or evening that is convenient to all of the members. In our guild we have a few friendship groups that meet during the daytime on a weekday (usually once a month) for a few hours. So far, we don't have any that meet on a weeknight, but if you are interested in such a time, chances are there are others that share your choice. As your Friendship Group Chair, I am hoping to find a place for everyone who is interested in a friendship group, even if it means forming a new group on Zoom and/or around a new time or place. Some of the groups listed below have reached maximum capacity and do not have room for new members, but the others have at least one space. Each friendship group chooses their own activities: charity quilt planning and sewing; left-right-center game with fat quarters on the line; machine and hand stitching; etc. The best part is that you get to name your new group with a clever name like the ones listed below, in alphabetical order:

Bits and Pieces (at capacity) Binding Friendships (at capacity)

Going to Pieces (first Thurs. a.m.—9:30-1; rotating homes; **room for one more**; makes round robin charity quilts; plays LRC)

Newbies (third Friday; 11-2 at Orange Quilt Bee; **room for a few**; makes charity quilts) Right Sides Together (second Saturday—at capacity in private home) machine & hand piecing; yearly Quilt of Valor; potluck lunch


