
The history of Baltimore Album quilts is a fascinating journey into an America heading for the Civil War. Discover how the industrial revolution, the struggle over slavery and the social and moral climate of the time contributed to this beautiful art form. Through stories, we will explore how the demise of Baltimore Album quilts leads us into the hearts and minds of the women who made them, and how this delightful mystery connects us with our sisters of long ago.

Jaimie has made quite a name for herself by her teaching and lecturing throughout the United States as well as many guilds. Her work has been shown in national and international exhibits including the Quilt Show in Huston, Texas, and the Pacific International Quilt Festival in Santa Clara, California. This year she was a featured teacher at Road to California.

Tuesday, February 25th

Jaimie Davis' workshop is called "Dizzy Daisies" and will show us how to master several techniques that she

has used in her projects. Dizzy Daisies is a dynamic project in which stems are the design focus. You will learn the more advanced freezer-paper-on -the-top method of appliqué, as well as how to make super-long stems and a simple hand embroidery stitch. With a limited color palette and a little bit of whimsy a delightful effect will be achieved.





Block of the Month



North Cities Quilt Guild February BOM 2020

(Make up to 5 blocks to receive a ticket for each block)

February Fun Facts:

Name means: Purification

Zodiac Sign: Aquarius

Flower: Violet

Birthstone: Amethyst

Cutting Instructions

<u>Side Strips:</u> Cut 4 strips 2" x 9 1/2" <u>Light Pink:</u> Cut 4 squares 2" x 2" Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8" Cut 1 strip 2" x 18" (extra allowed for squaring)


Heart material:

Cut 2 squares 3 7/8" x 3 7/8" Cut 1 strip 2" x 18" (extra allowed for squaring) Cut 1 square 3 1/2" x 3 1/2"

Sewing:



Sew light pink and heart strips together: 2" x 18" strip 2" x 18" strip. Cut 8 segments 2" x 3 1/2". Stitch together 2 segments to make four-patch unit). Make 4.



On wrong side of light pink, draw diagonal line. Layer square with red heart square, right sides together. Sew 1/4" seam on each side of marked line; cut apart on marked line. Press open to make pieced squares. Make 4.

Bits & Pieces

SOURIDE - WILCOME TO THE PARTY

Bring six blocks to exchange for each monthly meeting. The block is so (sew) fast to make! I really enjoyed the process and I hope you do as well!

Cutting Instructions:

Using the colored fabric of your choice cut one 5" square and four 2 1/2"squares for each block (Note: You can use a layer cake (10 X 10 square) this will yield 2 blocks.)

From the assorted white on white fabric cut a strip 1 ¼". Sub cut this strip into four 5" long rectangles. You will need four rectangles for each block.


Mark the diagonal on the wrong side of the 2 1/2" squares.




(Note: You will also need one white on white to finish the quilt cut at 6 1/2" X 6 1/2")


Block Construction:


Sew a 5" X 1 ¼" strip to two opposite sides of each colored 5" square. Press the seams out toward the strips. Add the strips to the other side of the square. (These won't match to the end but just center them on the square) Press the seams out toward the strips





Match the 2 ½" square to the edge of the strip at the side corner. Sew along the drawn line. Sew all four corners using this same technique. (You can trim the back with a 1/4 "seam but it's not necessary) Press seams away from the center to complete the block. Finished size is 6 ½" X 6 ½".

->Betty's next project was a Dachshund purse, another design by Sweetpea. Betty made this large tote from cork fabric with panels of Dachshunds on the sides.

in brown, blue and purple, she pieced and Marcia Pittman quilted. Betty started this UFO in Jan. 2019, in a class by Dee Christopher from Rancho Santiago College.

—>Betty next presented a twin quilt in blue, green and purple, the Guild Mystery Quilt from 2019, which she completed and Marcia Pittman quilted.

Mary Lou found the pattern, "Starry Skies," from Primitive Gatherings, while playing in her "scrap sandbox," and felt compelled to do it. She says, "No matter how many scrap quilts I make, my scrap pile does not get smaller!!" Just keep making those marvelous tiny squares, Mary Lou! We love them!</p>

—> Amy Estrada pieced, and Helene Born quilted, a multi-colored lap quilt in the Jelly Roll Race pattern. This was a UFO Amy started around 2015, because she wanted to use up her quarter yards of fabric. What a fun way to use them up, Amy!





<- Teresa Malinowski pieced and quilted two projects. The first, a Christmas tree wall hanging, features four "wreaths" formed of trees. The second, with a purple border and a red inner border, features scrappy 6" blocks—some which she made, some from block exchanges. You put them together beautifully, Teresa!



<— Loretta Beaumont pieced and quilted a lap quilt in charcoal and pink. The quilt, called "From this Day Forward," is a wedding gift. Loretta said the bride said, "pink and black," so she came up with this design to incorporate those colors. What a lovely wedding gift, Loretta!
