She began teaching in her local Adult Education department there.

Rose and her husband, Bill, moved to California in 2003 and she immediately became involved in the Hemet Valley Quilters guild and also started a club for quilters in Sun City, where they live. Around 2011 Rose organized a Quilts of Valor chapter in Sun City that has awarded hundreds of quilts to veterans "touched by war". Also, in 2011 Rose became a Quilt In A Day certified teacher. She enjoys teaching QIAD patterns and also teaches a Beginners Class in Sun City. Encouraging new quilters and making Quilts of Valor are her passions.





All quilts will be collected no later than the NCQG General Meeting April 24,2023. All quilts must submitted with a completed submission form and include a label on the back of the quilt with the Owners name and Quilt name. (A brief written description can also be included)

When you turn in your quilt, please put in inside a pillowcase. The quilt and pillowcase must be clearly labeled with owner's name and the name of the quilt. This data must the same on both labels. (This will keep the quilt clean and help our volunteers in identify your quilt and assist our team when returning the quilt to the owner.)

All quilts for display are due with Entry Form no later than April 24<sup>th.</sup> NO EXCEPTIONS.



## 2022-2023 BITS 'N' PIECES BLOCK EXCHANGE

## "Lotsa Luv"

Lotsa scraps? Here's an opportunity to use up some and have a variety of blocks for another project! For this year's pattern, make 7 blocks. Keep 1 for yourself and bring 6 to the guild meeting in a ziplock bag with your name on it. I'll swap out the

blocks and you'll go home with 6 different ones.

FOR 7 BLOCKS: (Unfinished 6 1/2"; Finished 6")

HEART: (Use a contrasting color)

A cut 731/2" squares

B cut 14 3 1/2" X 2 1/2" rectangles

BACKGROUND (Use white, gray, or black)\*

C cut 28 1 1/2" squares

D cut 14 3 1/2" X 1 1/2" rectangles

E cut 7 31/2" squares

\* The background fabric can have a small amount of either of the 2 other choices—white with a bit of gray or black for example.

### DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Snowball 2 C's onto long sides of B's
- 2. Sew D's onto top of B/C's
- Sew 1 B/C/D unit onto top of A
- Turn other B/C/D unit and sew onto bottom of E
- 5. Join the 2 units, referring to sketch

REMEMBER: 100% cotton; 1/4" seams; press; enjoy!




