

Here's what will be happening those days -

Block of the Month

North Cities Quilt Guild

January BOM 2020

(Make up to 5 blocks to receive a ticket for each block)

January Fun Facts:

Name means to see the past and future for new beginnings

Zodiac Sign: Capricorn

Flower: Carnation

Birthstone: Garnet

Cutting:



Color 1: one 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip one 2-1/2" x 20" strip




Color 2: One 4-1/2" square one 2-1/2" x 18" strip



Color 3: one 5-1/4" square



Color 4: one 2-1/2" x 10" strip one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip






Cut Color 1: 4-7/8" x 9-3/4" strip into two 4-7/8" squares. Stack those squares and cut them in half once on the diagonal to make two Half Square Triangles. Cut Color 1: 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares and stack and cut those into Half Square Triangles. Then cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 20" strip into eight 2-1/2" square

Cut Color 2: 2-1/2" x 18" strip into four 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles



Block of the Month cont'd



Cut Color 3: 5-1/4" square in half along both diagonals to make four Quarter Square Triangles



Cut Color 4: 2-1/2" x 10" strip into four 2-1/2" squares. Cut Color 4: 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack and cut those 2-7/8" squares once on the diagonal to make eight Half Square Triangles

Sewing:



Sew the Color 1 and Color 4 Half Square triangles right sides together in pairs, pressing the seam to the darker side. Make 8 unit's. Square to 2 1/2



Make four Flying Geese units using Color 1 and 2, Square to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2"..



Sew Color 3 Quarter Square unit to the top edge of the Color 2 4-1/2" square. Add another Quarter Square triangle to the opposing edge of the Square, and then two more to the adjacent edges. Press seam out towards the triangles



Add Color 1: 4-7/8" Half Square Triangles to each edge of the center unit, pressing seams towards the newly added triangles. Square to 8-1/2"

Bits & Pieces

SOURIE - WILCOME TO THE PARTY

Bring six blocks to exchange for each monthly meeting. The block is so (sew) fast to make! I really enjoyed the process and I hope you do as well!

Cutting Instructions:

Using the colored fabric of your choice cut one 5" square and four 2 1/2"squares for each block (Note: You can use a layer cake (10 X 10 square) this will yield 2 blocks.)

From the assorted white on white fabric cut a strip 1 ¼". Sub cut this strip into four 5" long rectangles. You will need four rectangles for each block.


Mark the diagonal on the wrong side of the 2 1/2" squares.




(Note: You will also need one white on white to finish the quilt cut at 6 1/2" X 6 1/2")


Block Construction:


Sew a 5" X 1 ¼" strip to two opposite sides of each colored 5" square. Press the seams out toward the strips. Add the strips to the other side of the square. (These won't match to the end but just center them on the square) Press the seams out toward the strips





Match the 2 ½" square to the edge of the strip at the side corner. Sew along the drawn line. Sew all four corners using this same technique. (You can trim the back with a 1/4 "seam but it's not necessary) Press seams away from the center to complete the block. Finished size is 6 ½" X 6 ½".

Charline Berg showed two quilts and one wall hanging she'd pieced and Emily Hanson in Montana quilted. The first, "Strippy Weave," was inspired by a similar quilt Charline had seen at Quilter's Faire in Palm Desert a few years ago, and finally bought material to make. The quilt, a gift for a 13-year-old, is from a pattern in the book *Garden Fresh Quilts*.

Charline also presented a twin-size quilt in Christmas colors, which was made during Monica's Palm Desert summer retreat. The pattern is called "Three or More," and it will be a gift to a client. What a fortunate client, Charline!

She also presented a wall hanging in Christmas colors featuring Santa, which she calls "HO3," as it says, "Ho Ho Ho." Charline bought the pattern at Road to California in 2018. This will also be given away. Charline, what beautiful, thoughtful gifts!
