Happy New Year Greetings from Helene Born the NCQG Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds representative (SCCQG) I attended the meeting held via Zoom on January 11,2025. It was informative and any member is welcome to attend these meetings although preregistration is required. The link for preregistration will be emailed to the members closer to the time. If you'd like the link please contact Helene Born <u>hborn07@yahoo.com</u> and I can forward the email when it is available.

Patrice Lambourne from the Camarillo Quilters Association discussed the collection of quilts for the victims of the Mountain Fire (Nov 2024). She explained that the people get to choose their quilt, so they need to be emotionally ready to go through this process so this will be a long-term distribution. They are also collecting quilts in a booth at Road to CA this month. If you'd like to sign up to man the booth, see the SCCQG website home page (The signup form is under "SCCQG Booth Staffing")

The counsel doesn't have a process in place for donations for the current fire victims. They need to have a process in place and form a team to handle this process before it can be implemented.

The various SCCQG officers provided updates and reports. The display exhibit for the Road to California will be hung in the atrium between the vendor halls. Please be sure to visit this area.

We were reminded to submit information about guild activities to post on the SCCQG calendar. (three months prior to the event) We also covered the need for 'additional insurance' for special events. This needs to be requested 60 days prior to the event.

Our topic for the January meeting was "Financial Documents." We reviewed some requirements for filing of taxes and a document with links to the government sites is posted in the meeting notes on the SCCQG website.



Rocky Mountain Chain






Fabric Requirements for a 10" Finished Rocky Mountain Chain Quilt Block:

- Light/White: 4 3" squares, 8 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles, and 16 1.5" squares
- Medium/Orange: 4 3" squares
- Medium/Blue: 5 2.5" squares
- Dark/Navy: 8 2.5" squares



Sewing Directions: Half Square Triangle Units: Step 1:

Using the Light/White 3" squares and the Medium/Orange 3" squares, piece together eight Half Square Triangles like the ones in the picture below. Trim/square up to 2.5" squares.



Square in a Square Units:

Step 2:

Using four of the Dark/Navy 2.5" squares and the 16 Light/White 1.5" squares, sew together four Square in a Square patches as shown in the picture below. I know these are small, but just take your time and they'll turn out great!



Step 3:

Lay out one of the Step 2 Square in a Square patches and two of the Light/White 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles as shown below.



Step 4:

Sew the two Light/White 1.5" x 2.5" rectangles to the Square in a Square patch and press the seam allowance toward the rectangle as shown in the picture below. **Repeat Steps 3 and 4 for a total of four Square in a Square units.**



Corner Units:

Step 5:

Lay out two Half Square Triangle units, one Medium/Blue 2.5" square, and one Dark/Navy 2.5" square as shown in the picture below. The Corner unit goes together like a typical <u>Four Patch</u> block.



Step 6:

Sew the patches into two rows and press the seam allowances away from the Half Square Triangle units as shown below.



Step 7:

Now sew the two rows together and press the seam allowances. You can see in the picture below that I used the tweak/twirl/furl method for pressing the seam allowances, but you can press however you prefer. **Repeat Steps 5 through 7 for a total of four Corner units.**



Putting It All Together: Step 8:

Lay out the Square in a Square units, the Corner units, and a Medium/Blue 2.5" square as shown in the picture below.



Step 9:

All that's left is to sew the units together like a uneven <u>Nine Patch</u>. Sew the units into three rows as shown below.



Step 10:

Press the seam allowances away from the Square in a Square units as shown below.



Step 11:

Almost done! Sew the three rows together - and...




Step 12:

Press the seam allowances toward the center of the block as shown in the picture below.




Final Quilt Layout options:

This block was fun to piece together! While it has a some small pieces, the piecing isn't difficult and produces a complex-looking block.




Here's just a plain Jane 4 x 4 layout. I do like the way it looks in a quilt.


Here's how it looks with a simple sashing and cornerstone layout. Each block shines on its own in this type of layout.



And here's a basic on-point layout. I think if the setting triangles continued the Medium/Orange triangles, it would look better.



And here we have on-point with sashing and cornerstones. In this example, I used a 1" wide sashing and I like it better than the 2" in the other example above.

NORTH CITIES QUILT GUILD TEMECULA RETREAT

MONDAY, JUNE 30 – Wednesday, July 2, 2025 Arrival - 10:00 a.m. Monday. Departure - after lunch on Wednesday.

Our Guild will be hosting its first ever overnight retreat this coming summer! As the coordinator, I am so excited that the Guild is sponsoring this opportunity for us to gather together to finish up some of our UFO's or start a brand new project, and have a great few days away from our daily routines. Getting to know our fellow Guild members better is an added bonus!

The retreat will be held at the Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center, located in the beautiful wine country of Temecula. If you've not had the opportunity to attend a retreat at this location, you are in for a real treat. The grounds are serene, secure, and private, overlooking the vineyards that are so prevalent in this part of the valley.

Our group will occupy a spacious and well-lit classroom – which has space for approximately 20 quilters. Each retreater will have a spacious area to "set up shop", with an additional *small* private space next to his/her table to set up a personal cutting/ironing station.

Sleeping accommodations are offered in clean and well maintained double rooms. Each room features two twin beds, a dresser/desk, a table and chair, with an attached bathroom (*no tub/shower only*). Rooms are air conditioned and/or heated, with the temperature controlled by the occupants. During your stay, all meals are included beginning with lunch at noon on Monday, and continuing through lunch on Wednesday. Meals are served in the dining room, which is located a short walking distance from the classroom. There are also provisions for those who prefer to drive to meals. The kitchen staff plans complete meals (yes, that means dessert is included!), and caters to those with special dietary requirements.

The Center also provides 24 hour availability to tea, coffee, and cocoa, and each classroom has its own small kitchen where there is a refrigerator and microwave for our use.

In addition to free time to sew, the guild will be busy planning some fun activities and door prizes. Now that you are excited to come with me on this new adventure, it's time to get signed up! There is a Registration Form in this newsletter. You can also register with our workshop chairman, Jill Patterson at the Guild general meetings, and the form will also be added to our website. As we are limited to the number of quilters who can attend – you won't want to hesitate. To sign up, you will need to return your Registration Form with a \$100 nonrefundable deposit (cancellations will be handled on a case-by-case basis). You can come with a friend from within the guild, or someone who is not a guild member. Retreaters who are not guild members will be required to pay the additional \$55 to join the guild as part of their fee. In return, they will be provided with 30 tickets to enter the drawing for a chance to win our new Opportunity Quilt!
