Complete the UFO entry form below with your name and the name or description of 5 projects that you would like to complete and turn it in with a \$10.00 entry fee (for prizes and supplies). Mail the entry to me Pathe Rainey 1019 Marina DR. Plac. 92970 or I can take it at the next guild meeting, or if we have any live events. Entries are accepted right up to the last turn in at the general meeting September ______202 3 forms will be in the newsletter and at the UFO table at the monthly meetings.

You will receive a participation ribbon upon my receiving an entry form. If the form is handed to me in person, you will receive your ribbon then. If through the mail, I will contact you as to where we can meet so that you may receive your ribbon. There will be five turn-ins from January to September 2023.

When you submit a "completed" UFO (that means it has been quilted, bound and has an affixed label) text photos or at a live meeting, we will put in a ticket for that night's turn-in prize drawing and you will receive your first 'turn-in' button. This will happen with each UFO you have turned in. Turn-in months are January, March, June, July, September

There is no limit as to how many UFO's you turn at a time. At the last turn-in, there will be a drawing for everyone who has completed any UFO and a final drawing for those who have completed all 5 UFO's.

2022-2023 BITS 'N' PIECES BLOCK EXCHANGE

"Lotsa Luv"

Lotsa scraps? Here's an opportunity to use up some and have a variety of blocks for another project! For this year's pattern, make 7 blocks. Keep 1 for yourself and bring 6 to the guild meeting in a ziplock bag with your name on it. I'll swap out the

blocks and you'll go home with 6 different ones.

FOR 7 BLOCKS: (Unfinished 6 1/2"; Finished 6")

HEART: (Use a contrasting color)

A cut 731/2" squares

B cut 14 3 1/2" X 2 1/2" rectangles

BACKGROUND (Use white, gray, or black)*

C cut 28 1 1/2" squares

D cut 14 3 1/2" X 1 1/2" rectangles

E cut 7 31/2" squares

* The background fabric can have a small amount of either of the 2 other choices—white with a bit of gray or black for example.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Snowball 2 C's onto long sides of B's
- Sew D's onto top of B/C's
- Sew 1 B/C/D unit onto top of A
- Turn other B/C/D unit and sew onto bottom of E
- 5. Join the 2 units, referring to sketch

REMEMBER: 100% cotton; 1/4" seams; press; enjoy!
