July Speaker and Workshop – Manny Caldera

We are so lucky to have Mr. Caldera as our speaker this month. He has cancelled all other speaking and workshop engagements for the rest of the year. You'll find out why at our meeting!

Caldera Quilting was established in 2017 with the intention of providing a service in long-arm quilting. This went on until January 2021, when Manny decided to learn how to service Featherweight sewing machines and the 301, 401, 402, and 403, as well.



He called Lloyd Askew, who owned Aspire, in January 2021 and asked to be trained in servicing Featherweights inside and out. Lloyd replied, "Well, only if you can answer two questions: Will you promise not to over-charge your customers? And will you service your customer's sewing machine as though it was your own?" Manny answered both questions correctly...and had his first training session in the next hour.

Speaking engagements and workshops have developed going forward, passing on what he learned from Lloyd. Manny has enabled the customer to service their own sewing machines without spending \$150.00 to \$300.00. Lloyd Askew passed away in May 2021 from cancer. Manny was his last student and continues to honor Lloyd by doing his best.

Manny will present a history of Singer sewing machines at our meeting. At the workshop, he will teach us how to service our own machines. There are four spaces left for this workshop. Contact me if you are interested in taking it, as we are opening it up to other guilds.

Blueberry pie in the sky



Fabric Requirements for a 12" Finished Blueberry Pie Quilt Block:

- Light/White: 4 - 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles, and 4 - 3" squares
- Light/Blue: 4 - 2.5" squares
- Medium/Green: 12 - 2.5" squares
- Dark/Purple: 4 - 3" squares
- Dark/Blue: 1 - 4.5" square, 4 - 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles, and 8 - 2.5" squares


Half Square Triangle Units:

Step 1:

Using the Light/White and Dark/Purple 3" squares, sew together Half Square Triangle units.

The picture below shows the four basic steps to making a Half Square Triangle.

- Mark a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back of one of the Light/White squares and sew 1/4" (or a little less) on each side of the line.
- Cut along the diagonal line. You will have 2 half-square triangle patches.
- Open up the patch and press the seam allowance toward the Light/White fabric.
- Trim the unit to 2.5" square.



Step 2:

Repeat Step 1 for a total of eight Half Square Triangles like the ones shown below. You can also find a 8-at-a-time method for making HSTs at <https://fabric406.com/blogs/fabric406-blog/two-easy-methods-for-making-half-square-triangle-quilt-blocks>

Flying Geese Units:

Step 3:

Using the Dark/Blue 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles and Medium/Green 2.5" squares, make a Flying Geese unit. You can find my detailed tutorial using my no-trim method for making perfect Flying Geese

at <https://fabric406.com/blogs/fabric406-blog/how-to-sew-a-basic-flying-geese-block>. In the picture below you can see the first four steps.



Step 4:

And here you can see the last four steps.



Step 5:

Repeat Steps 3 and 4 for a total of four Flying Geese units as shown below.

Step 6:

Repeat Steps 3 through 5 only using the Light/White 2.5" x 4.5" rectangles and Dark/Blue 2.5" squares for a total of four Flying Geese units like the ones in the picture below.



Middle Units:

Step 7:

Sew together one Step 5 and one Step 6 Flying Geese units as shown in the picture below. Press the seam allowance away from the blue/green unit.




Step 8:

Repeat Step 7 for a total of four Middle units as shown below.

Corner Units:


Step 9:

Lay out two Half Square Triangle units, one Medium/Green 2.5" square, and one Light/Blue 2.5" square as shown in the picture below. This unit goes together like a basic [Four Patch](#) block.




Step 10:

Sew the patches into two rows and press the seam allowances away from the Half Square Triangle pieces as shown. (Oops - you can see where I got carried away and marked the back of ALL the green squares!)



Step 11:

To complete the unit sew the two rows together and press the seam allowance toward the Light/Blue fabric as shown in the picture below.




Step 12:

Repeat Steps 9 through 11 for a total of four Corner units.

Putting It All Together:

Step 13:

Lay out the Corner units, the Middle units, and the Dark/Blue 4.5" square as shown below. From here the block goes together like a basic [Nine Patch](#) block.




Step 14:

Sew the units into three rows.

Step 15:

You can see in the picture below that I've pressed the seam allowances away from the Middle units.



Step 16:


Sew the three rows together to complete the block!

Step 17:

Press the seam allowances toward the center of the block as shown in the picture below. All done!

Layout Suggestions:

Here's a typical 4 x 4 layout using similar colors as in this tutorial. It's a bit busy for my taste.

Newsletter Editor Updates

Hello, friends!

Some of you know me from my days in California, others through our work on the newsletter, and some of you (I hope!) just enjoy reading it each month. However we're connected—hello again! I'm Marcia, and I started quilting back in 2013 when I joined the North Cities Quilt Guild. From my very first meeting, I was welcomed with open arms.

Not long after joining, I became pregnant, and my little one came along to every meeting. I dove headfirst into workshops (yes, I was *that* eager beaver who actually finished her first project!) and quickly fell in love with mystery retreats. I even hosted a friendship group, where I learned so much from all of you.

In 2018, our family relocated to the East Coast, but I still think of you every 4th Monday. And if you didn't already know—I'm still your newsletter editor! Staying connected through your photos, stories, and guild news brings me so much joy.

Last month, Trudy and I exchanged emails, and she invited me to share what I've been up to lately. Well—quite a bit has happened since the move!

In 2021, I opened *Sew Happy Studios*, a quilt shop in High Point, North Carolina. What began as a space for teaching sewing classes to kids and adults has blossomed into a vibrant quilt shop with a curated selection of fabrics, a full class schedule, and a whole lot of creative energy.

One of the shop's most exciting features is our Kids Sewing Program. Every summer, we host week-long camps (Monday–Thursday, 9–3) for kids ages 8 and up. We jump right in on day one, and by Friday, they've completed several projects—and can't wait to return.

During the school year, I run weekly after-school classes with guided curriculums that build skills over time. Some of my students are now in their *fourth* year! This summer marks our *fifth* year of camps, and watching the same kids grow and return each year is truly heartwarming.

I'm fortunate to have amazing assistants, and our classroom is equipped with speed-controlled machines to keep things safe. For kids with machines that don't have speed control, we help them learn to sew slowly and carefully. Safety is always our top priority.

Teaching kids takes patience, but they don't come in expecting perfection—they just want to make something cool! I often ask, "Do you want to fix it, or leave it as is?" That sense of ownership builds confidence, and watching them grow through sewing is the best part of my job.

Another recent update: I'm now serving as President of our local chapter of the Modern Quilt Guild here in the Triad. It's been an incredibly rewarding role, and I've learned so much from this passionate, talented group. That learning shows up every day as I lead—and I'm grateful for it.

Thank you for letting me share this update. I carry the lessons and friendships from NCQG with me always, and I hope to visit in person someday soon.

MYSTERY RETREAT IS COMING UP SOON! GET READY TO MAKE “CHURNING STARS”

We will be holding our annual Mystery Retreat at the Yorba Linda Presbyterian Church, at 19301 E Yorba Linda Blvd, YL. on August 22nd and 23rd, 2025.

Our hours will be – Friday night, August 22nd. Set up will start at 4:30 p.m., with the first clue handed out at 5:00 p.m. Sewing will continue until 9 p.m. (If you can't attend Friday night, don't worry – you can still participate).

We will all return Saturday morning, August 23rd, at 9:00 a.m. to sew until 4:00 p.m. or until you just can't sew anymore.

Your \$80.00 registration fee includes your pattern and instructor (aka, seam ripper/presser), morning refreshments, and your lunch – plus our usual door prizes and surprises!

You provide your fabric selections, your sewing supplies, and a snack to share on Friday evening.

As we are limited to 24 participants, you will want to register early to avoid missing out. Jill Patterson will be taking registrations at the Workshop Table until all spots are filled, and I will have information packets for you to pick up at the June meeting.

Since I know you all like to shop the sales and your stash – here is a preview of the fabrics needed to make this quilt which finishes at 66"x86".

This will be a 3 fabric quilt – 3 yards background-or light value fabric; 3 ½ yards dark fabric; and 1 ¼ yards medium fabric. The border fabric requirement is 1 1/3 yards. (This is where you can express yourself by picking a large scale bold print). ¾ yards is needed for the binding. Reminder – contrast is key to making an eye catching quilt.

Don't worry, I'll repeat this information in your instruction packet.

Hope you can join me for a fun and productive day! *P.S. There will be homework!*


