Lecture: Abecedary of Quilts

Workshop: Marrion Square. This is a 25" square, that can be made scrappy or for different seasons of th eyear. The pattern should be purchased and printed in color (see following pages for instructions). You will provide your own fabrics, so the pattern can be your colorful guide

#### Option #2. Personal check

If you do not have a PayPal account, you may send a separate check, made payable to Elizabeth Eastmond, along with your check for your class fee, made payable to NCQG. In order to use this method, you must have an active e-mail account. Once Elizabeth has been notified that you are registered for the class and you wish to purchase your pattern using this method, she will send you an e-mail with a link to download the pattern. Print pattern in color.

When you have purchased the pattern, you will have all the information you need to select your fabrics and directions you will need for class preparation.

Diana Fish will be teaching again this year so you are definitely guaranteed a good time and a beautiful quilt. We know what a crazy year this has been for everyone, so we are so happy to be able to offer a bit of "normalcy."

#### Here's the basics:

- ✓ Yorba Linda Presbyterian Church 19301 E Yorba Linda Blvd., Yorba Linda. (Same location as last year)
- ✓ This year we are offering two identical Mystery Retreats You can choose either Friday, August 28<sup>th</sup> or Saturday, August 29<sup>th</sup>. Each Retreat will start at a different time depending on the day of your Retreat. This is necessary to accommodate set up and tear down of the facility.

FRIDAY RETREATERS: You will be able to enter the building at 9:30 a.m. for set up. Your retreat will end at 9:00 p.m.

SATURDAY RETREATERS: You will be able to enter the building at 8:30 a.m. for set up. Your retreat will end at 8:00 p.m.

### **Bits & Pieces**

### SOURINI - WINDLOOMUN TOO TUHUN IPAIRTY

Bring six blocks to exchange for each monthly meeting. The block is so (sew) fast to make! I really enjoyed the process and I hope you do as well!

### **Cutting Instructions:**

Using the colored fabric of your choice cut one 5" square and four 2 1/2"squares for each block (Note: You can use a layer cake (10 X 10 square) this will yield 2 blocks.)

From the assorted white on white fabric cut a strip 1 ¼". Sub cut this strip into four 5" long rectangles. You will need four rectangles for each block.


Mark the diagonal on the wrong side of the 2 1/2" squares.




(Note: You will also need one white on white to finish the quilt cut at 6 1/2" X 6 1/2")


### **Block Construction:**


Sew a 5" X 1 %" strip to two opposite sides of each colored 5" square. Press the seams out toward the strips. Add the strips to the other side of the square. (These won't match to the end but just center them on the square) Press the seams out toward the strips





Match the 2 ½" square to the edge of the strip at the side corner. Sew along the drawn line. Sew all four corners using this same technique. (You can trim the back with a 1/4 "seam but it's not necessary) Press seams away from the center to complete the block. Finished size is 6 ½" X 6 ½".





### **July Block of the Month**

## <sup>Y</sup>North Cities Quilt Guild July BOM 2020 [Sunny Lanes]

(Make up to 5 blocks to receive a ticket for each block)


### Fabric and Cutting Instructions:

White- Color 1: Cut 8 2" squares; Cut 3 1/2" x 28" strip into eight 3 1/2 squares.


Red -Color 2: Cut 24 2" squares

Blue- Color 3: Cut 7" x 13" strip into four 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles





Make 4 Four Patch units, use these for the corner units.



Sew one 16 patch unit: measures 6 1/2 "




To make one side unit, place a <u>Color 1 square (3 1/2)</u> right sides together atop a Color 3 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew ON this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam

allowance. Press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another Color 1 square on the other end of the rectangle, sewing in a parallel direction to the first sewn seam. Make two of these in the same manner. Make two in the opposite direction. They should measure 3-1/2" x 6-1/2".


