June Speaker and Workshop – Dona McKenzie

Dona McKenzie has been deeply immersed in creative pursuits her entire life. Born and raised in Los Angeles, she spent her childhood drawing and painting. In her mid-twenties, she moved to New York to pursue her dream as a graphic designer. That was followed by the establishment of a highly successful creative services studio in Westport, Connecticut. Her interest in teaching led to an M.A. in Graphic Communications Management and Technology from NYU late in life. A skiing accident brought her back to drawing and introduced her to quilting. In 2019, she returned to Los Angeles where she is quilting, drawing, teaching and enjoying life at the beach in Venice.

Dona is a Studio 180 certified instructor, taught by Deb Tucker. Oversizing and trimming down to perfection give her joy and guarantees that blocks will match up.

Dove in the Window workshop

The Dove in the Window block can be challenging due to its Y seams. We'll use one of the Studio 180 tools—the Tucker Trimmer I or III or the Magic Wand to create this block with ease and precision. The instructions are for a bed runner, but you can use them as a jumping point for your own personal creation—a quilt, wall hanging, or table runner.

Strawberry Smoothie



Cutting Requirements for 12" finished block (scant 1/4" seam allowance):

- **(A) Dark Red:** Cut FOUR (4) 2 1/2" squares. (FOUR (4) corners of quilt block)
- **(B) Dark Red:** Cut ONE (1) 5 1/4" square. Then cut the square diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles.
- **(C) Red:** Cut TWO (2) 5" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. Cut on line to make FOUR (4) triangles.
- **(D) Bright Pink:** Cut TWO (2) 5" squares. On the back side of the squares draw a diagonal line, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. Cut on line to make FOUR (4) triangles.
- **(E) Light Pink:** Cut ONE (1) 4 1/2" square. (center of quilt block.)
- **(F) Light Pink:** Cut FOUR (4) 3" squares. Then cut the squares diagonally, corner-to-corner, ONE (1) time. You will end up with EIGHT (8) triangles.
- **(G) Light Pink:** Cut ONE (1) 5 1/4" square. Then cut the square diagonally, corner-to-corner, TWO (2) times. You will end up with FOUR (4) triangles.

Sewing instructions:

1: Sew TWO (2) **F Light Pink** triangles to **A Dark Red** Square per picture below. You should have FOUR (4) sets.



2: Sew **D Bright Pink** triangle to bottom of each set from Step 1. Square each block to 4 1/2 inches.

June BOM—Cont'd



3: Sew each **(B) Dark Red** triangle to **(G) Light Pink** triangle. Then sew **C Red** triangle to each set as shown in picture below to make the **FOUR (4) Split Quarter-Square Triangles**. Square each block to 4 ½ inches.




4: Sew block together in rows per picture below and trim to 12 ½ inch block.

If you make TWELVE (12) "Strawberry Smoothie Quilt Blocks," you will end up with the quilt top pictured above. The size will be 36" x 48" finished, 36 1/2" x 48 1/2" unfinished.

SCCQG DISASTER FUND

Disaster Fund grant checks have gone out to the six affected guilds: Santa Monica Quilt Guild, Westside Quilt Guild, Glendale Quilt Guild, Wandering Foot Quilt Guild and Camarillo Quilters Association. The guilds will help their affected members replace some of their sewing supplies and tools.

EATON, PALISADES, AND MOUNTAIN FIRE VICTIMS - Call for Quilts and Pillowcases for Kids

The Camarillo Quilt Guild team has held their final distribution for quilts for the Mountain Fire Survivors. In the meantime, quilts are currently being distributed to the survivors of the Palisades and Eaton fires. While we received a lot of quilts at Road to California, and many more since then, they have been distributed, and we need more!

We are requesting new quilts, lap size and bed size, which will be distributed at recovery events in the Palisades and Eaton areas. We're also collecting **Pillowcases for Kids** to distribute to the children who attended schools that were destroyed. Please email us at sccqgfire@sccqg.org, if you have quilts or pillowcases to donate. We will work with you to help shuttle them to the correct location or provide a shipping address. We have some storage capability in the South Bay, Santa Monica, and Glendale areas. In addition, the Simi Valley Quilt Guild is also providing storage space. However, storage hasn't been a big problem. Currently, the quilts collected seem to find new homes on a regular basis through what we're calling the "everyone knows someone who knows someone that was affected network."

MYSTERY RETREAT IS COMING UP SOON! GET READY TO MAKE “CHURNING STARS”

We will be holding our annual Mystery Retreat at the Yorba Linda Presbyterian Church, at 19301 E Yorba Linda Blvd, YL. on August 22nd and 23rd, 2025.

Our hours will be – Friday night, August 22nd. Set up will start at 4:30 p.m., with the first clue handed out at 5:00 p.m. Sewing will continue until 9 p.m. (If you can't attend Friday night, don't worry – you can still participate).

We will all return Saturday morning, August 23rd, at 9:00 a.m. to sew until 4:00 p.m. or until you just can't sew anymore.

Your \$80.00 registration fee includes your pattern and instructor (aka, seam ripper/presser), morning refreshments, and your lunch – plus our usual door prizes and surprises!

You provide your fabric selections, your sewing supplies, and a snack to share on Friday evening.

As we are limited to 24 participants, you will want to register early to avoid missing out. Jill Patterson will be taking registrations at the Workshop Table until all spots are filled, and I will have information packets for you to pick up at the June meeting.

Since I know you all like to shop the sales and your stash – here is a preview of the fabrics needed to make this quilt which finishes at 66”x86”.

This will be a 3 fabric quilt – 3 yards background-or light value fabric; 3 ½ yards dark fabric; and 1 ¼ yards medium fabric. The border fabric requirement is 1 1/3 yards. (This is where you can express yourself by picking a large scale bold print). ¾ yards is needed for the binding. Reminder – contrast is key to making an eye catching quilt.

Don't worry, I'll repeat this information in your instruction packet.

Hope you can join me for a fun and productive day! *P.S. There will be homework!*

NORTH CITIES QUILT GUILD TEMECULA RETREAT

MONDAY, JUNE 30 – Wednesday, July 2, 2025

Arrival - 10:00 a.m. Monday. Departure - after lunch on Wednesday.

Our Guild will be hosting its first ever overnight retreat this coming summer! As the coordinator, I am so excited that the Guild is sponsoring this opportunity for us to gather together to finish up some of our UFO's or start a brand new project, and have a great few days away from our daily routines. Getting to know our fellow Guild members better is an added bonus!

The retreat will be held at the Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center, located in the beautiful wine country of Temecula. If you've not had the opportunity to attend a retreat at this location, you are in for a real treat. The grounds are serene, secure, and private, overlooking the vineyards that are so prevalent in this part of the valley.

Our group will occupy a spacious and well-lit classroom – which has space for approximately 20 quilters. Each retreator will have a spacious area to “set up shop”, with an additional *small* private space next to his/her table to set up a personal cutting/ironing station.

Sleeping accommodations are offered in clean and well maintained double rooms. Each room features two twin beds, a dresser/desk, a table and chair, with an attached bathroom (*no tub/shower only*). Rooms are air conditioned and/or heated, with the temperature controlled by the occupants. During your stay, all meals are included beginning with lunch at noon on Monday, and continuing through lunch on Wednesday. Meals are served in the dining room, which is located a short walking distance from the classroom. There are also provisions for those who prefer to drive to meals. The kitchen staff plans complete meals (yes, that means dessert is included!), and caters to those with special dietary requirements.

The Center also provides 24 hour availability to tea, coffee, and cocoa, and each classroom has its own small kitchen where there is a refrigerator and microwave for our use.

In addition to free time to sew, the guild will be busy planning some fun activities and door prizes.

Now that you are excited to come with me on this new adventure, it's time to get signed up! There is a Registration Form in this newsletter. You can also register with our workshop chairman, Jill Patterson at the Guild general meetings, and the form will also be added to our website. As we are limited to the number of quilters who can attend – you won't want to hesitate. To sign up, you will need to return your Registration Form with a \$100 nonrefundable deposit (cancellations will be handled on a case-by-case basis). You can come with a friend from within the guild, or someone who is not a guild member. Retreators who are not guild members will be required to pay the additional \$55 to join the guild as part of their fee. In return, they will be provided with 30 tickets to enter the drawing for a chance to win our new Opportunity Quilt!
