There was a special SCCQG meeting held on February 15, 2025, via zoom regarding the distribution of quilt collected for the recent fire survivors. This was attended by various guild members affiliated with SCCQG. It was decided to establish a fund of \$5,000 for the survivors of the that lost their home in the Eaton & Palisade fires. SCCQG will provide the guild with \$250 per member that is a fire survivor. The guild will have to provide information for this donation. If monetary donations are received, they will be added to the fund. There was discussion regarding the quilts, sewing items, and funds received at Road to California. The money collected at Road will not be included in this fund.

There were items of quilting supplies collected at Road are still in storage but there may be a need for donations of sewing machines. We would like to support sewers of all natures so Costume designers and sewing machine store owners would be included as possible candidates for donations. The funds collected at Road would be available for these people in the form of a gift card.

There is a need for storage of the quilts collected at Road to California. They are researching options with hospitals and other facilities. Collection and distribution will be an ongoing project.

Quilts will be distributed to each surviving family member. The children especially treasure receiving a quilt. They will also accept pillowcases and will be in contact with the schools. SCCQG will work with non-profit agencies to coordinate the distribution of items collected. They will also be in contact with schools as to the need.

We are still collecting more quilts as this project will be a long-term process of at least two years. SCCQG is and is requesting new quilts of all sizes so are requesting that the size is indicated on quilts turned in.

Use the Tucker Trimmer to create this bed runner or use it as the start of a new quilt.



NORTH CITIES QUILT GUILD TEMECULA RETREAT

MONDAY, JUNE 30 – Wednesday, July 2, 2025

Arrival - 10:00 a.m. Monday. Departure - after lunch on Wednesday.

Our Guild will be hosting its first ever overnight retreat this coming summer! As the coordinator, I am so excited that the Guild is sponsoring this opportunity for us to gather together to finish up some of our UFO's or start a brand new project, and have a great few days away from our daily routines. Getting to know our fellow Guild members better is an added bonus! The retreat will be held at the Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center, located in the beautiful wine country of Temecula. If you've not had the opportunity to attend a retreat at this location, you are in for a real treat. The grounds are serene, secure, and private, overlooking the vineyards that are so prevalent in this part of the valley.

Our group will occupy a spacious and well-lit classroom – which has space for approximately 20 quilters. Each retreater will have a spacious area to "set up shop", with an additional *small* private space next to his/her table to set up a personal cutting/ironing station.

Sleeping accommodations are offered in clean and well maintained double rooms. Each room features two twin beds, a dresser/desk, a table and chair, with an attached bathroom (*no tub/shower only*). Rooms are air conditioned and/or heated, with the temperature controlled by the occupants. During your stay, all meals are included beginning with lunch at noon on Monday, and continuing through lunch on Wednesday. Meals are served in the dining room, which is located a short walking distance from the classroom. There are also provisions for those who prefer to drive to meals. The kitchen staff plans complete meals (yes, that means dessert is included!), and caters to those with special dietary requirements.

The Center also provides 24 hour availability to tea, coffee, and cocoa, and each classroom has its own small kitchen where there is a refrigerator and microwave for our use.

In addition to free time to sew, the guild will be busy planning some fun activities and door prizes. Now that you are excited to come with me on this new adventure, it's time to get signed up! There is a Registration Form in this newsletter. You can also register with our workshop chairman, Jill Patterson at the Guild general meetings, and the form will also be added to our website. As we are limited to the number of quilters who can attend – you won't want to hesitate. To sign up, you will need to return your Registration Form with a \$100 nonrefundable deposit (cancellations will be handled on a case-by-case basis). You can come with a friend from within the guild, or someone who is not a guild member. Retreaters who are not guild members will be required to pay the additional \$55 to join the guild as part of their fee. In return, they will be provided with 30 tickets to enter the drawing for a chance to win our new Opportunity Quilt!


