MARCH 23, 2021 A FREE ZOOM WORKSHOP WITH OUR OWN RITA JONES!!



Hi ladies! I'm so excited to be teaching again-and to be teaching a quilt pattern that helps us use up our scraps and turn them into something beautiful!

If asked my most tried and true quilting tips, they would be:

- 1. The importance of a uniform 1/4" seam allowance.
- 2. Pressing every seam before joining units.

3. Measuring borders to fit your quilt top rather than just sewing them on and cutting off the extra. Just as I know that no one likes to see my flabby underarms waving in the breeze, I don't want to see my quilt borders waving either!

I also am a big fan of starch! While we all have our favorite brand, I know its tempting to cut corners and not starch. Then I remember how much better my project will turn out, and how much easier it will be if I can eliminate some of the fabric stretch.

In case you don't know me, here's a little personal history. I have lived in Placentia, in the house with the "friendly" courtyard for 34 years, having moved here from Washington state. We have 2 children - a boy and a girl - and they each have two children - a boy and a girl.

I worked at Brea Olinda high school for 19 years as a secretary to an Assistant Principal. Our area of responsibility was Activities and Facilities. I counted tons of money over those years

(think yearbooks and prom tickets), in addition to going to "camp" with the student council every summer at UC Santa Barbara. It was a really fun job. However, with the birth of my granddaughter and helping with her and then with her brother, was even better!

After I retired, I worked one day a week and began teaching at Cozy Cottage in Brea. I soon learned how kind and sharing my fellow quilters are, and still keep in touch with many of those same ladies today.

I started attending NCQG soon after the guild was formed. Once again, I have been privileged to meet some wonderful, and generous fellow quilters. You ladies are THE BEST.

I hope you'll join me at the free zoom class on Tuesday, March 23rd. Feel free to come and go as your schedule permits.

The quilt is an easy one, so everyone will be successful, and I'll look forward to seeing your completed projects at show and tell.

Wondering if you want to take Rita's class on March 23rd? Here's what we are making! Tons of ways to set these blocks and clean out lots of scraps.

Preparation for the Free Workshop on March 23

- If you plan to participate, you can start gathering your scraps now. You will need:
 •A variety of strips 1 ½" in width. Strips must be at least 10" in length. The block has so much potential. You can use different fabrics, solids, prints, same tone, scrappy the sky is the limit.
 - •One 10" square of background fabric for each 4 blocks you want to make. This fabric can be all the same – or scrappy. It does not need to be a solid but must contrast with your scraps.

Here are a couple of examples that you can use to help you decide how many blocks you would like to make. Since each 10" square makes 4 blocks, you will need:

18 - $6\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks for an 18" x 36" table runner. You will also need 5 – 10" background squares or approximately 5/8 yards of one fabric.

 $72 - 6 \frac{1}{2}$ " blocks for a small lap quilt, approximately 48" x 54". You will also need 18 - 10" background squares or approximately 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " yards of background fabric.

Block Of The Month March 2021

This years BOM 2021 will be Novelty Blocks. Many times they will coincide with a Holiday for that month. Reminder that the BOM is an opportunity to use your stash. I will provide the main fabric as supplies last. As always I am here to help: provide fabric, drop off material and pick up completed blocks. Thank you all for participating.

Make up to 5 for the BOM raffle.

Tullps

Block size is 9"

Cutting:






Color 1: one 2-1/2" x 10" strip AND one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip



Color 2: one 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strip

Color 3 needs: one 3" x 9" strip AND one 1-1/2" x 10" strip AND one 1-1/2" x 6" strip AND one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip


Assembly:



Cut Color 2: 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" strip into five 1-1/2" squares

Cut Color 3: 3" x 9" strip into four 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles. 1-1/2" x 10" strip into four 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles 1-1/2" x 6" strip into four 1-1/2" squares

> Stack Color 1 and Color 3 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strips, right sides together, marking the 2-7/8" square lines, marking the diagonals in the directions shown at left, and then sewing 1/4" above and below the marked diagonals, pivoting at the 2-7/8" square lines. Cut apart ON the marked diagonals, and cut apart on the square lines as well. You will have eight half squares. Press seams to darker side. They should measure 2-1/2" ...



Sew together four pairs of Color 2/Color 3 small squares, pressing seams towards the darker side. Sew Color 3 short rectangles to the tops of the square-pairs. Make two in each orientation shown at left



Sew the block's corner units: sewing a half square to each pieced square/rectangle unit. Sew another half square to the Color 1 squares. Sew these two new units together to make a corner. Make two of each of the corner units shown at far left, then piece the block as shown.
