April Speaker and Workshop

Ann Turley will be driving up from Fallbrook to regale us with her quilt journey of original pieces based on travel, words and phrases and a lot of "what would happen if I...?"

Ann has been a judge at California County Fairs, including Los Angels and Orange. She has also been part of the judging team for the Hoffman Challenge and Road to California, among other local events. Ann enjoys judging



because it gives her the opportunity to closely examine and learn from the work of others.

Ann has been involved in several quilt guilds and has served on the boards of these guilds in various capacities.

At our workshop the next day, participants will learn the secret behind the rough-cut process, ending with realistic, dipping tree branches. These branches form the perfect backdrop for a variety of seasonal leaves cut and assembled by the students. Leaves are formed with black and white fabrics as well as your favorite seasonal prints then disassembled. and reconstructed on a black background. Ann guides you through the design process and in placing the leaves among the branches. Easy enough for the beginner, challenging enough for the seasoned quilter. This wall hanging or the beginning of a quilt lends itself to embellishment and can be designed for any season. If you are interested in this workshop and learning a new technique, sign up quickly—there is a supply list. Any questions, contact Jill Patterson.

You can write your information directly on the pillowcase or we suggest using a piece of muslin or other plain, solid color fabric cut to an appropriate size for your label. Print your name and the name of the quilt on it, and stitch label onto the cuff of the pillowcase using a basting or large zigzag stitch. (Please see photo example of suggested label)

When you turn in your quilt on April 24, please put it inside a pillowcase. The quilt and pillowcase must be clearly labeled with your name and the name of the quilt which is the same on both labels. This will help our volunteers in identifying and matching



MYSTERY RETREAT IS COMING UP SOON! GET READY TO MAKE "CHURNING STARS"

We will be holding our annual Mystery Retreat at the Yorba Linda Presbyterian Church, at 19301 E Yorba Linda Blvd, YL. on August 22nd and 23rd, 2025.

Our hours will be – Friday night, August 22nd. Set up will start at 4:30 p.m., with the first clue handed out at 5:00 p.m. Sewing will continue until 9 p.m. (If you can't attend Friday night, don't worry – you can still participate).

We will all return Saturday morning, August 23rd, at 9:00 a.m. to sew until 4:00 p.m. or until you just can't sew anymore.

Your \$80.00 registration fee includes your pattern and instructor (aka, seam ripper/presser), morning refreshments, and your lunch – plus our usual door prizes and surprises!

You provide your fabric selections, your sewing supplies, and a snack to share on Friday evening.

As we are limited to 24 participants, you will want to register early to avoid missing out. Jill Patterson will be taking registrations at the Workshop Table until all spots are filled, and I will have information packets for you to pick up at the June meeting.

Since I know you all like to shop the sales and your stash – here is a preview of the fabrics needed to make this quilt which finishes at 66"x86".

This will be a 3 fabric quilt – 3 yards background-or light value fabric; 3 ½ yards dark fabric; and 1 ¼ yards medium fabric. The border fabric requirement is 1 1/3 yards. (This is where you can express yourself by picking a large scale bold print). ¾ yards is needed for the binding. Reminder – contrast is key to making an eye catching quilt.

Don't worry, I'll repeat this information in your instruction packet.

Hope you can join me for a fun and productive day! P.S. There will be homework!



NORTH CITIES QUILT GUILD TEMECULA RETREAT

MONDAY, JUNE 30 – Wednesday, July 2, 2025

Arrival - 10:00 a.m. Monday. Departure - after lunch on Wednesday.

Our Guild will be hosting its first ever overnight retreat this coming summer! As the coordinator, I am so excited that the Guild is sponsoring this opportunity for us to gather together to finish up some of our UFO's or start a brand new project, and have a great few days away from our daily routines. Getting to know our fellow Guild members better is an added bonus! The retreat will be held at the Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center, located in the beautiful wine country of Temecula. If you've not had the opportunity to attend a retreat at this location, you are in for a real treat. The grounds are serene, secure, and private, overlooking the vineyards that are so prevalent in this part of the valley.

Our group will occupy a spacious and well-lit classroom – which has space for approximately 20 quilters. Each retreater will have a spacious area to "set up shop", with an additional *small* private space next to his/her table to set up a personal cutting/ironing station.

Sleeping accommodations are offered in clean and well maintained double rooms. Each room features two twin beds, a dresser/desk, a table and chair, with an attached bathroom (*no tub/shower only*). Rooms are air conditioned and/or heated, with the temperature controlled by the occupants. During your stay, all meals are included beginning with lunch at noon on Monday, and continuing through lunch on Wednesday. Meals are served in the dining room, which is located a short walking distance from the classroom. There are also provisions for those who prefer to drive to meals. The kitchen staff plans complete meals (yes, that means dessert is included!), and caters to those with special dietary requirements.

The Center also provides 24 hour availability to tea, coffee, and cocoa, and each classroom has its own small kitchen where there is a refrigerator and microwave for our use.

In addition to free time to sew, the guild will be busy planning some fun activities and door prizes. Now that you are excited to come with me on this new adventure, it's time to get signed up! There is a Registration Form in this newsletter. You can also register with our workshop chairman, Jill Patterson at the Guild general meetings, and the form will also be added to our website. As we are limited to the number of quilters who can attend – you won't want to hesitate. To sign up, you will need to return your Registration Form with a \$100 nonrefundable deposit (cancellations will be handled on a case-by-case basis). You can come with a friend from within the guild, or someone who is not a guild member. Retreaters who are not guild members will be required to pay the additional \$55 to join the guild as part of their fee. In return, they will be provided with 30 tickets to enter the drawing for a chance to win our new Opportunity Quilt!
