Quilt Blocks for Habitat for Humanity

Philanthropy Cubby Hole Blocks for Habitat for Humanity

Keep 'em coming! I have two twin tops completed and likely two more on the way!

I have made a decision to use the red and white blocks for the youth bedrooms and now I am requesting the same blocks in a more subdued color way for the adults. This may seem odd to you, but give it a try. Make the same Cubby Hole blocks in black with white/cream, brown with white/cream, or purple with white/cream. This will be a more neutral color scheme with just a pop of color.

Cutting instructions for one block

Use color for center and whites for the frame or you can reverse and use white for the center and the color in the frame.

Cut one center square 3.5"

Cut 2 rectangles 1.5" x 3.5" for 2 sides of the frame

Cut 2 rectangles 1.5" x 5.5" for top and bottom of the frame

They will measure 5.5" square cut edge to cut edge. Do not trim. Use an accurate 1/4" seam allowance and use good quality quilting cottons.

Drop them in the box on my front porch, pop them in the mail or give them to me at our inperson meeting in September!

Thank you for your continuing support in this special partnership with the Yorba Linda Presbyterian Mission Committee. Everyone is excited for the day this family moves into their new home and our beautiful quilts will be in their welcome basket.

October 26th Workshop With Lori DeJarnatt

"Crazy Cushion"

The last workshop of 2021! Come join the fun!



If you want to feel comfortable, this is the workshop for you!

Becky McDaniel will be the master instructor! She will teach us how to make a paper-pieced CRAZY

CUSHION. This is how she describes the class:

"This "Crazy Cushion" is paper pieced with 3 different designs—**Star Jasmine, Pineapple, Flying Geese** "I will show you how to do paper piecing using a light box. This technique makes it so much easier to get the points perfect! You will learn how to make the welting and the large hand quilting with pearl cotton to make your cushion pop." "This cushion also has a zipper which makes it easier to wash if necessary. I will show you how to set and stabilize your zipper and put a fun handle on so that carrying your cushion is easier!"

Kits are available in 3 sizes at \$35 each. The kit will include:

- ⇒ Printed Paper Piecing Pages (16 pages)
- ⇒ 16x16x3 firm foam cushion
- ⇒ 3 ¾ yards of cotton cording
- ⇒ 22" x 1 ½" strap
- ⇒ 22" zipper
- ⇒ Pattern

Becky will also have available:

Neutral Fabric @ \$11/yd YLI Monofilament Thread @ \$8 Sue Spargo #8 embroidery thread @ \$5 Big Stitch Needles @ \$6 for a package of 12 needles 9"x9" wool mats @ \$18 Light tablets @ \$25

Becky will also have instructions on how to order the cushion from an online vendor or you can buy foam at any local upholstery supply.
