It was great to have our guest speaker Kathryn Pellman last month to see her fashionistas and to see you ladies asking questions.

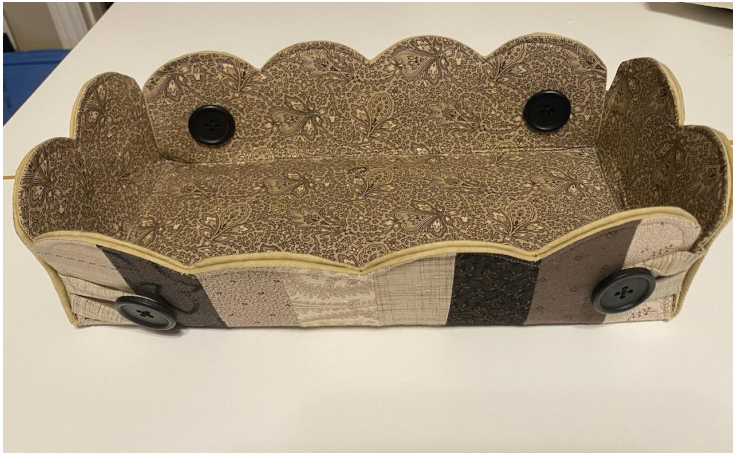

November is a fun month for all of us. Many festivities, cooking for family ( or them for us), and the spirit of community. Last month we reflected on the amount of contributions to our donation centers and their overwhelming happiness for what they received. Each month I have been Show Casing a donation center in this newsletter. This month, since it is the beginning of the new year I want to show case our own Philanthropy Team. There are a number of new members that may not know the names or faces yet so here is a chance to meet all of the group.

## Block of the Month 2023-2024 Rules

Fun times ahead this year! Below are the rules for BOM and the sample block. The theme this year will be Traditional Blocks.

BOM will occur in the months of October, January, February, April, June, July, August, and September. BOM will be dark in the months of November, December, March and May.

To provide some consistency in the quilt you may wish to make at the end of this year please use these colors or any hues of the same colors for your blocks.

Red, gold/yellow, blue, cream, gray, green: either solids or with a print.

Make 2 blocks, keeping one and turning in one. After the guild meeting break the BOM's will be distributed to the participants. The participants will pick up the next BOM at this meeting. A sample of the next block will be at that same meeting.

**You are making a 12" finished block.**

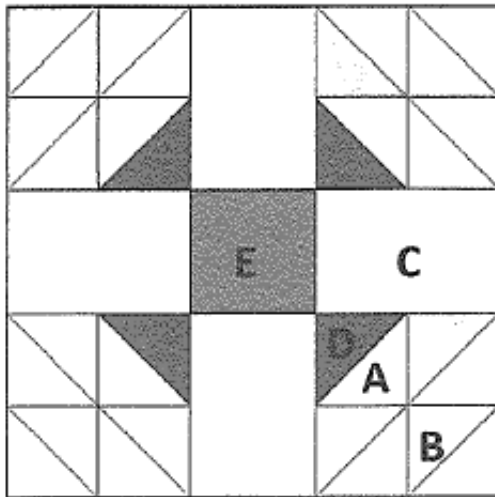

## Sewing Instructions

**Note: Use 1/4" seam allowance for all seams.**

1. Sew an "A" piece to a "D" piece. Press to the "D" piece. Make 4 total.



2. Sew an "A" piece to a "B" piece. Press to the "B" piece. Make 12 total.



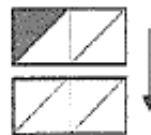
3. Sew a step 1 unit to a step 2 unit. Press to the step 2 unit. Make 4 total.



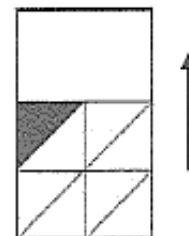
4. Sew a step 1 unit to a step 1 unit. Press to the right. Make 4 total.



5. Sew a step 3 unit to a Step 4 unit. Make 4 total.



6. Sew a "C" piece to the top of a step 5 unit following the layout. Make 2 total.

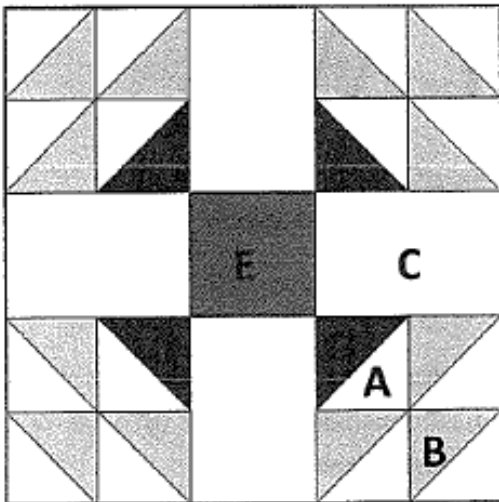

Note: Use  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance for all seams.

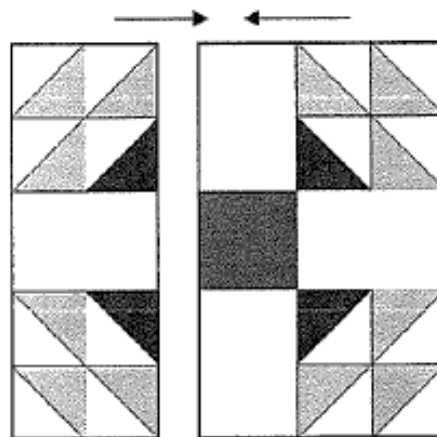
7. Sew a step 5 unit to the bottom of a step 6 unit. Make 2 rows.



8. Sew a "C" piece to the top and bottom of the "E" piece. Make 1 row.



9. Assemble rows.



# NCQG Bits & Pieces 2023-2024

A great way to use up those scraps, especially your 2 1/2" strips. Participate just one month or every month. Months we are dark you can also make blocks and turn them in the month before or after.

Make 7 blocks. One to keep and 6 to exchange.

## Calico Spools


This makes a 6" finished block.


6" + 1/4 in seam allowances on all sides= 6 1/2 inch square

### \*\* Supplies List \*\*

 medium or dark print One 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle AND one 2-1/2" x 10" strip

 **WHITE or WHITE ON WHITE** One 5" x 6-1/2" rectangle

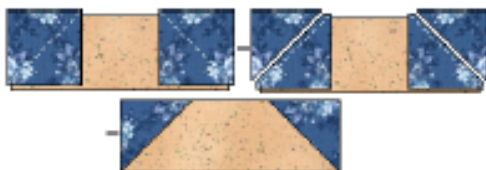
### \*\* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block \*\*



Cut the print fabric 2-1/2" x 10" strip into four 2-1/2" squares...



Then cut the **white** fabric 5" x 6-1/2" rectangle into two 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles...



To make the side units, place a Color 1 square right sides together atop the left and right ends of a Color 2 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. (I show them staggered here just so you can see what fabric pieces I mean) On the back of the squares lightly mark the diagonal. Sew ON this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the triangle. Make two of these. They should measure 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" when completed...



Now lay out all units as shown at left. Stitch together using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seams to center, and you are all done! Nice and Easy! :o) Square should be 6 1/2"
