Kathryn Pellman is an artist, fashionista, quilter, cook, baker, gardener and storyteller. She is known for her whimsical series of small, playful, single frame cartoons featuring long limbed and knobby kneed Fashionistas that invoke fashion illustration. Commercial fabric is her paint; thread is her ink and the sewing machine her pen. Her quilts have a strong connection to traditional quilting including the sandwiching and stitching of three layers together.

In her lecture Katheryn will share how she uses Fashionistas mixed with some Word Salad to combine her passions of fashion and quilting to celebrate and explore the world of women and femininity, their lives, friendships and romantic relationships, real and imagined.

Kathryn is a Juried Artist member of SAQA (Studio Art Quilters Association), has a Certificate in Fashion Design and has been sewing since she could thread a needle. She lectures and teaches both nationally and internationally including Festival of Quilts, Birmingham, England and Quilt Festival Houston. Kathryn is the author of *Word Salad, Fashionistas and Girlfriends and the* coauthor of *Backart -- On the Flip Side*. Block of the Month 2023-2024 Rules

Fun times ahead this year! Below are the rules for BOM and the sample block. The theme this year will be Traditional Blocks.

BOM will occur in the months of October, January, February, April, June, July, August, and September. BOM will be dark in the months of November, December, March and May.

To provide some consistency in the quilt you may wish to make at the end of this year please use these colors or any hues of the same colors for your blocks.


Red, gold/yellow, blue, cream, gray, green: either solids or with a print.

Make 2 blocks, keeping one and turning in one. After the guild meeting break the BOM's will be distributed to the participants. The participants will pick up the next BOM at this meeting. A sample of the next block will be at that same meeting.

You are making a 12" finished block.

Sewing Instructions


 Sew an "A" piece to the left side of a "E" piece. Sew along the diagonal. Press to the "A" piece.




Sew an "A" piece to the right side of the "E" piece. Sew along the diagonal. Press to the "A" piece. Make 8 total.




- Sew two step 1 units together. Make 4 total.
- Sew a "D" piece to the top of the step 2 unit. Make 4 total.



Note: Use ¼" seam allowance for all seams.






6. Assemble rows.

Sewing Instructions (continued)

- Sew a "C" piece to the sides of a step 3 unit. Press to the "C" pieces. Make 2 rows.
- Sew two of the step 3 units to opposite sides of the "B" piece. Make 1 row.







NCQG Bits & Pieces 2023-2024

A great way to use up those scraps, especially your 2 1/2" strips. Participate just one month or every month. Months we are dark you can also make blocks and turn them in the month before or after.

Make 7 blocks. One to keep and 6 to exchange. Use white OR white on white fabric for the background and medium to dark print for the spools.

Calico Spools

This makes a 6" finished block !






* Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 10" strip into four 2-1/2" squares ...





Too make the side units, place a Color 1 square right sides together atop the left and right ends of a Color 2 rectangle, with outer edges aligned. (I show them staggered here just so you can see what fabric pieces I mean) On the back of the squares lightly mark the diagonal. Sew ON this diagonal marking. Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the triangle. Make two of these. They should measure 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" when completed...

Now lay out all units as shown at left. Stitch together using a scant 1/4" seam. Press seams to center, and you are all done! Nice and Easy! :0) ...now on to Page 2!
