October Block of the Month - Scrappy Leaf Block - 12" finished/12.5 unfinished


Tutorial: https://thecraftyquilter.com/2022/09/free-scrappy-leaf-block-pattern/

Suggestions: Use a variety of fall leaf colors for leaf pieces. Layout pieces before sewing to test the color layout.



Cutting for 1 leaf block

Color	Qty	Piece	Size
background	1	А	5" square
background	2	В	2.5" x 4.5" rectangle
background	3	С	3" square
background	1	D	2.5" Square
background	2	Е	2.5" Square
leaf (different colors)	2	F	2.5" x 4.5" rectangle
leaf (different colors)	3	G	3" Square
leaf (different colors)	6	Н	2.5" square
Stem	1	Ι	1" x 7" rectangle
border	4	J	2" x 10" rectangle
corner stone	4	K	2" square



- Please read ALL instructions before starting.
- Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance.
- RST = right sides together
- HST = half square triangle
- Most seams are pressed open; follow pressing arrows when shown

Piecing steps

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each background (C) square.

2. Place marked (C) square RST with a colored (G) square. Stitch on each side of the diagonal line.

3. Cut apart on the diagonal line and press open or towards the dark.

4. Trim HST unit to 2.5"

5. Make 6 HST units in a variety of colors.

6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of two background (E) squares.

7. Place one marked (E) square RST on one end of a colored (F) rectangle. Stitch on the line.

8. Trim seam allowance and press towards the background fabric.

9. Make a MIRROR image of the pieced rectangle from above by repeating steps 6-8, making sure the diagonal line is going in the opposite direction.

10. Cut the background (A) square in half diagonally to create two triangles.

11. With RST, place the (I) rectangle on the long side of one triangle, matching centers. Stitch.

12. Repeat using the other triangle.

13. Press seams open OR toward the background fabric.

14. Trim Stem Unit to 4.5" square.

Assembly

15. Arrange the B rectangles, HST's, pieced rectangles, H squares and stem unit as shown on the cover image.


16. Assemble the pieces into sections as shown. Press all seams open.

17. Square up sections using the table below-right.

18. Sew the sections together to create a leaf block. Trim to 10" block.


19. Sew Side borders to leaf block

20. Sew cornerstone to each end of top and bottom borders, then sew to top and bottom of leaf block. Trim to 12.5 unfinished block size.









Bits and Pieces 2024-2025

The perfect way to use up your scraps, and by exchanging them with other members you can make a scrap quilt with a vary wide variety of prints.

Make 10 of these blocks. Keep 1 for yourself. Bring 9 to the meeting in a ziplock bag with your name on it. From these 9, 7 will be traded and 2 will go into a group raffle quilt. Every month you participate your name will be entered into the raffle to win a finished quilt made from these blocks.

You can use the same print on all of your blocks or have a variety, BUT both print pieces in a single block are to be the same print. You may turn in more than one set each month if you would like to have a larger quilt.

To make one block:

From" White on White" fabric, cut one 21/2 inch square

From the same print fabric, cut one 2 1/2 inch square and one 2 1/2 by 4 1/2 inch rectangle

With right sides together sew one white square to one print square

Then iron seam towards the print fabric

With right sides together sew this 2 block unit to the rectangle print

Then iron towards the rectangle

NORTH CITIES QUILT GUILD TEMECULA RETREAT

MONDAY, JUNE 30 – Wednesday, July 2, 2025 Arrival - 10:00 a.m. Monday. Departure - after lunch on Wednesday.

Our Guild will be hosting its first ever overnight retreat this coming summer! As the coordinator, I am so excited that the Guild is sponsoring this opportunity for us to gather together to finish up some of our UFO's or start a brand new project, and have a great few days away from our daily routines. Getting to know our fellow Guild members better is an added bonus!

The retreat will be held at the Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center, located in the beautiful wine country of Temecula. If you've not had the opportunity to attend a retreat at this location, you are in for a real treat. The grounds are serene, secure, and private, overlooking the vineyards that are so prevalent in this part of the valley.

Our group will occupy a spacious and well-lit classroom – which has space for approximately 20 quilters. Each retreater will have a spacious area to "set up shop", with an additional *small* private space next to his/her table to set up a personal cutting/ironing station.

Sleeping accommodations are offered in clean and well maintained double rooms. Each room features two twin beds, a dresser/desk, a table and chair, with an attached bathroom (*no tub/shower only*). Rooms are air conditioned and/or heated, with the temperature controlled by the occupants. During your stay, all meals are included beginning with lunch at noon on Monday, and continuing through lunch on Wednesday. Meals are served in the dining room, which is located a short walking distance from the classroom. There are also provisions for those who prefer to drive to meals. The kitchen staff plans complete meals (yes, that means dessert is included!), and caters to those with special dietary requirements.

The Center also provides 24 hour availability to tea, coffee, and cocoa, and each classroom has its own small kitchen where there is a refrigerator and microwave for our use.

In addition to free time to sew, the guild will be busy planning some fun activities and door prizes. Now that you are excited to come with me on this new adventure, it's time to get signed up! There is a Registration Form in this newsletter. You can also register with our workshop chairman, Jill Patterson at the Guild general meetings, and the form will also be added to our website. As we are limited to the number of quilters who can attend – you won't want to hesitate. To sign up, you will need to return your Registration Form with a \$100 nonrefundable deposit (cancellations will be handled on a case-by-case basis). You can come with a friend from within the guild, or someone who is not a guild member. Retreaters who are not guild members will be required to pay the additional \$55 to join the guild as part of their fee. In return, they will be provided with 30 tickets to enter the drawing for a chance to win our new Opportunity Quilt!


