2022-2023 BITS 'N' PIECES BLOCK EXCHANGE

"Lotsa Luv"

Lotsa scraps? Here's an opportunity to use up some and have a variety of blocks for another project! For this year's pattern, make 7 blocks. Keep 1 for yourself and bring 6 to the guild meeting in a ziplock bag with your name on it. I'll swap out the

blocks and you'll go home with 6 different ones.

FOR 7 BLOCKS: (Unfinished 6 1/2"; Finished 6")

HEART: (Use a contrasting color)

A cut 731/2" squares

B cut 14 3 1/2" X 2 1/2" rectangles

BACKGROUND (Use white, gray, or black)*

C cut 28 1 1/2" squares

D cut 14 3 1/2" X 1 1/2" rectangles

E cut 7 31/2" squares

* The background fabric can have a small amount of either of the 2 other choices—white with a bit of gray or black for example.

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Snowball 2 C's onto long sides of B's
- Sew D's onto top of B/C's
- Sew 1 B/C/D unit onto top of A
- Turn other B/C/D unit and sew onto bottom of E
- 5. Join the 2 units, referring to sketch

REMEMBER: 100% cotton; 1/4" seams; press; enjoy!





The proposed amendments to the Guild by-laws will be voted on at the OCTOBER general membership meeting, and will be in effect after that date. This means that our dues/opportunity ticket purchases will NOT CHANGE for those renewing their membership for this current year. It will impact new members joining later in the 2023-24 year, and all Guild members in the 2024/25 year.

Please come prepared with your questions.

BYLAW AND STANDING RULES REVISIONS - PRESENTED TO GENERAL MEMBERSHIP - 10/23/23

ARTICLE 5. MEMBERSHIP

The membership year shall be from the current September general membership meeting to the subsequent year's September general membership meeting [10/23/23]

Annual membership dues of \$55.00 include \$30.00 per year for membership dues and \$25.00 per year in support of the Opportunity Quilt. [10/23/23] This fee shall be paid by the current September general membership meeting. Guild membership shall be considered delinquent at the close of the October general membership meeting. Prorated membership dues for new members are available at one half yearly dues and one half yearly Opportunity Quilt support beginning with the January meeting. [10/27/08] [07/24/17] [10/23/23]

Each member shall be provided with a membership card and 30 (or 15 if prorated) tickets for the Opportunity Quilt drawing. Provisions will be made for members experiencing financial hardship. [10/23/23]

The Guild membership list shall not be used for commercial purposes. [10/23/23]

Members shall not use their affiliation with the Guild as a means to sell merchandise or to raise funds for another organization either at the general membership meeting or at any Guild activity. [10/23/23]

Children under the age of sixteen are not eligible for membership, and as such, shall not attend Executive Board meetings or workshops. Attendance at general membership meetings shall be at the purview of the board. [10/23/23]

ARTICLE 7. ELECTED OFFICERS

The elected officers of this Guild are designated as the **Executive Board** and shall include the President, First Vice President, Second Vice President/Programs, Second Vice President/Workshops, Treasurer, and Secretary. Each position shall be filled by one member. [10/23/23]

THE PRESIDENT SHALL:

Post the monthly newsletter, after approving contents, via e-mail to members and newsletter sponsors, and Webmaster. (The Webmaster works at the direction of the President, and is responsible for updating our website monthly with news, newsletter, and current NCQG board members.) [10/23/23]

THE FIRST VICE PRESIDENT SHALL:

Present to the Executive Board at the August meeting a proposed listing of special events for the upcoming Guild year including event, date, and location, [10/23/23]

Act as the coordinator to the Guild's special events which are not considered regular programs or workshops. [01/28/2020] The First Vice President shall be responsible for forming committees and meeting with them on a regular basis to implement these special events and shall make regular reports to the Executive Board.[10/23/23]

THE SECOND VICE PRESIDENT FUTURE PROGRAMS SHALL: [06/27/05]

Create a postcard listing future programs, workshops, and facilitate distribution. [07/24/17] This postcard shall include a picture of the current Opportunity Quilt which shall be obtained from the Opportunity Quilt chair. [10/23/23]

THE TREASURER SHALL:

Keep records of all financial transactions of the Guild. This shall include requiring all members to turn in all monies collected on behalf of the Guild, and providing proof of expenditures prior to reimbursement. [10/23/23]

Sell tickets to all events either at the event or prior to the event. [10/23/23]

ARTICLE 8. PARLIAMENTARIAN

Shall be responsible for the election process at the August general membership meeting by asking for nominees from the floor. If there are none, the Parliamentarian shall pronounce nominations closed and may call for a vote by the general membership. Guidelines for additional nominations from the floor can be found under Article 10.

Establish and chair a committee to review Bylaws and Standing Rules semiannually or as needed. [07/24/17] [10/23/23]

ARTICLE 10. NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

A member in good standing may be nominated from the floor at the August general membership meeting by another member in good standing, and be considered as a candidate for an Executive Board position. [10/23/23]

ARTICLE 12. AMENDMENTS

The Standing Rules and Bylaws committee shall be selected semi-annually or as necessary. It shall consist of the current President, the Parliamentarian, and at least one member in good standing from the general membership. This committee will seek input from all members prior to meeting to discuss revisions. [10/23/23]

The committee shall present proposed revisions to the Executive Board, and publish the proposed revisions in the newsletter, with voting by the membership at the general membership meeting following publication as stated above. [10/23/23]

II. EXECUTIVE BOARD

Shall select the printing vendor for all Guild printing needs. [10/23/23]

Shall determine which member(s) shall be responsible for the use and care of guild equipment [10/23/23]

Shall provide a gift of appreciation for participating Patchwork Stars.[10/23/23]

III. PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

If a reciprocal agreement with other participating guilds is in effect, and when space is available, members of those participating guilds may sign up for and participate in our Guild workshops at our member rate. Our Guild members may participate in participating guilds' workshops, when space is available, by signing up in advance and paying their guilds' workshop rate. [10/23/23]

Shall encourage members to provide peanut free refreshments to serve at the general membership meetings. [10/23/23]

5. OPPORTUNITY QUILT

Shall coordinate the making of tickets and sale of tickets for the and ticket sales of Opportunity Quilt. [10/23/23]

Shall distribute tickets to Guild members for purchase. when purchased. [10/23/23]

Shall turn in to the treasurer all income derived from ticket sales with an accounting for number of tickets sold. [10/23/23]

Shall provide a picture of the current Opportunity Quilt to the 2nd Vice President for inclusion on the postcard. [10/23/23]

7. PHILANTHROPY DIRECTOR

Shall provide items of recognition for Guild committees and special events as needed and as available. [10/23/23]

Shall be responsible for communicating to the Website Administrator. The Website Administrator is responsible for writing and updating programs for online payments for membership, workshops, luncheon, and special events. [10/23/23]

SPECIAL COMMITTEES:

2. BLOCK OF THE MONTH COORDINATOR

Shall present to the Executive Board a proposal for the annual Block of the Month program each October for approval prior to the inception of the plan.

Shall prepare a drawing of the quilt block along with directions, fabric color(s), block size and templates which can be made by members of the Guild for a drawing at the general membership meeting each month. This information shall be easily accessible to the membership by making it available to the Guild Newsletter Editor and the Webmaster the month prior to the actual due date. provide a drawing of the quilt block, directions, templates and necessary information for the Newsletter Editor the month prior to the actual due date and decide if more

than Determine if more than one prize drawing is needed at any one general meeting due to the amount of blocks submitted. [10/23/23] (Change in wording for clarification)
