Jane continued to quilt with a group of ladies one Saturday a month at the Yorba Linda Masonic Lodge. There were about 30 ladies quilting in her honor this month, September 7, 2024.

Philanthropy

I would like to take this issue of the newsletter to congratulate all of you for your robust contributions to the philanthropy efforts this year. It takes so many people to make this happen. Below are the persons directly responsible for a number of the "tasks" that continue each year behind the scenes.

<u>Paulette Fletcher:</u> coordinates the donation centers, keeps track of the number of quilts and other items that are donated, accepts donations of fabric and notions, distribution of quilts, maintains the guilds relationship with the donation centers, makes the placemat kits, writes the newsletter, and participates in all philanthropy activities and sew days.


Cutting:

Color 1 DARK: one 7" x 14" strip

Color 2 Contrast: one 2-3/8" x 11-7/8" strip AND one 2" x 16" strip

Color 3 Light: 4" x 14" strip AND one 7" x 13" strip AND one 2" x 14" strip AND


one 2-3/8" x 11-7/8" strip




cutting the Color 1 7" x 14" strip into eight 3-1/2" square




cut the Color 2 2" x 16" strip into eight 2" squares...



Cut the Color 3 4" x 14" strip into fourteen 2" squares.



Cut the Color 3 7" x 13" strip into four 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles.




Cut the Color 3 2" x 14" strip into four 2" x 3-1/2" rectangles..


speed piece the half squares, by stacking the Color 2 and Color 3 2-3/8" x 11-7/8" strips, right sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of the top strip, lightly mark the 2-3/8" square lines and mark the diagonals in the direction shown at left. Now sew a SCANT 1/4" above and below the

marked diagonals, pivoting at the square lines. Now cut apart ON the marked diagonals,


and on the 2-3/8" square lines. This will give you ten half squares. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabric. Trim these back to measure 2"



using two Color 3 2" squares and two of the half squares we just made, make the unit shown at left. Make five units like this



Using Color 3 squares, the small flying geese units, and the extra corner unit...construct one of the block's center unit as shown at left.



Now lay out all of the blocks units as shown at left. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom rows to the center, and the middle row to the outside. Join the three rows

Scrappy Applique with Kristie Naranjo Saturday, November 2

Use your scraps to create a one-of-a-kind design that can become either a wall-hanging, lap quilt, or a center panel. You can buy a pattern at https://www.kristienaranjo.com/shop or Kristie will have some patterns to sell at our meeting. Most patterns come in multiple sizes and are downloads; you will want to print the small or medium size for the workshop. Have plenty of scraps! Since the workshop is a few days after Kristie's lecture, you'll have time to gather materials together after her talk and seeing her own creations.

No precutting needed and you probably won't need a sewing machine, either. Supply list will be sent upon registration.

NORTH CITIES QUILT GUILD TEMECULA RETREAT

MONDAY, JUNE 30 – Wednesday, July 2, 2025

Arrival - 10:00 a.m. Monday. Departure - after lunch on Wednesday.

Our Guild will be hosting its first ever overnight retreat this coming summer! As the coordinator, I am so excited that the Guild is sponsoring this opportunity for us to gather together to finish up some of our UFO's or start a brand new project, and have a great few days away from our daily routines. Getting to know our fellow Guild members better is an added bonus! The retreat will be held at the Vina de Lestonnac Retreat Center, located in the beautiful wine country of Temecula. If you've not had the opportunity to attend a retreat at this location, you are in for a real treat. The grounds are serene, secure, and private, overlooking the vineyards that are so prevalent in this part of the valley.

Our group will occupy a spacious and well-lit classroom – which has space for approximately 20 quilters. Each retreater will have a spacious area to "set up shop", with an additional *small* private space next to his/her table to set up a personal cutting/ironing station.

Sleeping accommodations are offered in clean and well maintained double rooms. Each room features two twin beds, a dresser/desk, a table and chair, with an attached bathroom (*no tub/shower only*). Rooms are air conditioned and/or heated, with the temperature controlled by the occupants. During your stay, all meals are included beginning with lunch at noon on Monday, and continuing through lunch on Wednesday. Meals are served in the dining room, which is located a short walking distance from the classroom. There are also provisions for those who prefer to drive to meals. The kitchen staff plans complete meals (yes, that means dessert is included!), and caters to those with special dietary requirements.

The Center also provides 24 hour availability to tea, coffee, and cocoa, and each classroom has its own small kitchen where there is a refrigerator and microwave for our use.

In addition to free time to sew, the guild will be busy planning some fun activities and door prizes. Now that you are excited to come with me on this new adventure, it's time to get signed up! There is a Registration Form in this newsletter. You can also register with our workshop chairman, Jill Patterson at the Guild general meetings, and the form will also be added to our website. As we are limited to the number of quilters who can attend – you won't want to hesitate. To sign up, you will need to return your Registration Form with a \$100 nonrefundable deposit (cancellations will be handled on a case-by-case basis). You can come with a friend from within the guild, or someone who is not a guild member. Retreaters who are not guild members will be required to pay the additional \$55 to join the guild as part of their fee. In return, they will be provided with 30 tickets to enter the drawing for a chance to win our new Opportunity Quilt!
