These three talented quilters presented a range of quilts and styles and told their stories of how they became the quilters they are today. This year's Patchwork Stars:

Paulette Fletcher

Paulette was born at the Women's Naval Hospital Coronado Island, San Diego. She went to high school in Norwalk, and graduated from Cal State Dominguez Hills where she received her MSN in nursing. She is now happily retired. Her quilting adventures began when her mother gave her some Japanese fabric when she could no longer sew, and requested a quilt. After that, she began taking classes at Calico House. Her favorite thing about quilting is how you making models with wonderful fabric and the outcome is different each time. Her least favorite thing about quilting is ripping out and resewing (we hear you sister!) She loves to have Jelly Beans and Diet Dr. Pepper at her side when whipping up her amazing quilts and her sewing superpower is not being afraid to try new things!

Tina Hawbaker

Tina was born in a small farming town in Nebraska and her family moved to California when she was in high school. She has a BA in Child Development from Cal State Fullerton and runs a childcare center in Los Alamitos for infants and preschoolers. She learned to sew in 4H classes and in Home Ec but dove into quilting when she became a babysitter for Debi Hanna while Debi took quilting classes. As their friendship grew, Debi taught her how to quilt. Her favorite thing about quilting is English Paper Piecing and binding by hand - she finds hand work therapeutic. Cutting, however, is her least favorite thing and now she always buys extra fabric just in case of error (she even purchased an Accuquilt machine to help). She nibbles on peanut butter pretzels as she zips along with her sewing. She also recently purchased a long arm machine and is working on her free motion skills. Her sewing superpower is playing with colors and picking out fabric (people often compliment her on her choices), She wishes her superpower was in the organization and completion of projects - something we all can relate to with Tina!

Peggy Ochoa

A Canadian by birth, Peggy was born in Nova Scotia Canada and was move to Whittier and its warmer climes by her father who was tired of shoveling snow. She has dual American and Canadian citizenship. She was a full-time Mom and began taking quilting in a Whittier Adult Ed class and completed her first quilt in 1975. From there she went on to winning first prize at the LA County Fair in 1980, taught quilting at the Santa Fe Springs recreation department. She taught literature and writing classes at Cal State Fullerton until her retirement in 2020. Her favorite thing about quilting is choosing colors and planning layouts. Her least favorite - making the quilt sandwich on her dining room table. Peggy's quilting superpower is accuracy in piecing. Block Of The Month Sept 2022

This years BOM 2021- 2022 will be Quilting and Sewing notion theme. You will get to use different sewing techniques during this next year.

Make 2- one for yourself and one to turn in. You will receive a different block in return.

The block is 12 1/2 " when completed.

Cutting instructions:

Background (White-A)

A 1 - 4 x 5" rectangle

B 1- 4x6" rectangle

C 1- 2 1/2 X 3 1/2" rectangle

D 1- 1 1/2 x 4" rectangle

E 1-11/2 x 2" rectangle

F 1- 2x2" square

G 13 x 3" square

H 1- 1 1/2 x5" rectangle

I 1- 1 1/2 x1 1/2" square

J 1-1 x 1" square

K 1-2 1/2 x 12 /2" rectangle

Knob (dark gray)

L 1 -1 x 2 1/2" rectangle

Iron Top and Iron (medium gray)

M 1 -1 1/2 x 7 1/2" rectangle

N 1 - 1 1/2 x 12 1/2" rectangle

Iron accent color (any color you wish)

O 1-2 1/2 x 9" rectangle

Iron Body (any color you wish)

P 1-21/2 x 3" rectangle



Q 1- 2x2" share

R 1-3 x 11 1/2" rectangle

Assembly:


Join the C piece to the top of the L piece.
 Join the A piece to the left side of the L piece and join the B piece to the right side of the L piece to form the L unit which should measure 4" x 12 1/2"




2. Join the D piece to the left side of the M piece and join the E piece to the right side of the M piece to form the M unit. Join the M unit to the bottom of the L unit to form the top iron unit which should measure 5" x 12 1/2"




3. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the Q piece. With the right sides facing, layer the Q piece on the bottom right corner of the O piece. Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam and press. In the same manner, mark the F piece. With the right sides facing, layer the F piece on the top right corner of the O piece. Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam and press.




4. Join the P piece to the left side of the O piece. Join the R piece to the bottom of the O piece to form the O unit which should measure 5" x 11 1/2"




5. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the G piece. With the right sides facing, layer the G piece on the top left corner of the O unit. Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam and press. Join the H piece to the left side of the O unit to form the iron unit which should measure 3" x 12 1/2"



6. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the I piece. With the right sides facing, layer the I piece on the top left corner of the N piece. Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam and press. In the same manner, mark the J piece. With the right sides facing, layer the J piece on the bottom right corner of the N piece. Stitch on the drawn line and trim 1/4" away from the seam and press. Join the K piece to the bottom of the N piece to form the N unit which should measure 3 1/2" x 12 1/2"



7. Join the top iron unit to the top of the O unit and join the N unit to the bottom of the O unit to form the finished block which should measure 2 1/2" x 12 1/2"

Description

The background is off-white. There are 32 units requiring paper piecing and four paper pieced sections = one unit. So, I had to make 128 paper piecing sections. There are 31 flowers and each has 8 petals made with applique = 248 flower petals. I needed to make and applique 256 leaves.
